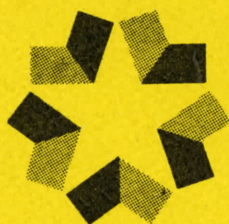

LAKE AND SCHOLARSHIPS ARE DONATED BY HARVEY

M. J. Harvey, founder and chairman of the board of Tyler Pipe Industries, announced Tuesday night, during a meeting of the Tyler Chapter of the National Secretaries Association, the donation of a seven acre lake to the new permanent campus of TSC and five continuing scholarships.

The seven acre lake, which is expected to cost \$150,000, will be located in the center of the new TSC campus on Spur 248. The lake will be built during Phase I construction and will become the focal point of the new campus.

Harvey stated that the scholarship bequest will become effective "as soon as details can be worked out with the college."

Harvey's two announcements came immediately following an address by Dr. James H. Stewart, Jr. in which he announced that "bids for preliminary site development of Phase I are expected to be ready for the Board of Regents within the next two to three weeks."

FIRST COMMENCEMENT PLANNED FOR MAY 14

Tyler State College will graduate its first nine students at commencement exercises at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, May 14, at Harvey Hall located at the East Texas Fairgrounds.

Senator A. M. Aikin, Jr. has been selected as TSC's first graduation speaker.

Candidates for graduation include Wilma Jean Gardner Broadfoot, Thomas Malcolm Graham, Wanda Lee Travis Guinn, Joseph Miller and Bobby Dean Moore. These five candidates are seeking a Bachelor of Arts.

Deborah Meadows Jackson is a candidate for a Bachelor of Science.

Dana R. Benson, Patricia Webb Garrett and James Arlis Wooley are seeking a Bachelor of Business Administration.

All TSC faculty and staff members will be receiving an invitation to the graduation exercises.

It is hoped that the TSC community will plan to attend this historical event.
