

I. Rezoning Request to the City Plan Commission, City of Tyler

Judge Harry Loftis and I appeared before the City Plan Commission on Thursday, April 4, 1974, to protest in behalf of the Board of Regents of Tyler State College the rezoning request by Thomas D. Boucher on property located in close proximity to the campus site on Spur 248. After statements from both sides were presented, a motion to deny Mr. Boucher's request was made and the Commission unanimously adopted this motion, thus supporting the Tyler State College position.

II. Attorney General's Opinion No. H-268

The Attorney General's Opinion relative to my request of November 6, 1973 concerning the validity of restrictions on the authority of state colleges to employ outside legal counsel imposed by the current Appropriations Act was received Thursday, April 4, 1974. The complete Opinion No. H-268 is attached for your information.

III. Coordinating Board Staff Comments on Tyler State College Master Planning and Phase I Building Program

During an informal visit last Thursday with Commissioner of Higher Education Dr. Bevington Reed and Facilities Director Gordon Flack, both these individuals were highly complimentary of the Tyler State College master plan and phase I buildings. They had recently looked at our master plan document and preliminary architectural document which shows the building plans, building form, building style, etc. They are anxious, along with the Board and administration, to see the project under way.
