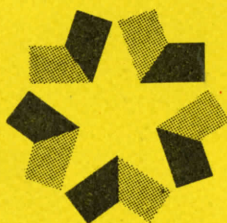

BOARD OF REGENTS BY-LAWS

The By-Laws of the Board of Regents of Tyler State College states that regular meetings of the Board of Regents shall be held quarterly on the second Wednesday of the months of January, April, July, and October, on the campus of the College in Tyler, in the Board Room of the college, or at such other place as may be determined by the Board in advance of its meeting.

The Board of Regents, the By-Laws further states, shall convene annually on the first Wednesday of April, or as soon thereafter as practical. The Board shall convene on the campus of the college for such meetings. The April meeting of the Board shall be known as the Annual Meeting.

Special meetings of the Board of Regents may be called by the Chairman of the Board of Regents, President of the College, or the Executive Committee. Written notice by telegraph or mail of the time, place and purpose of the Special Meeting shall be given to each member of the Board not less than three days prior to the date of the meeting. No other business than that contained in the notice of the Special Meeting may be considered by the Board, unless unanimous consent of the members of the Board.

A majority of the Board of Regents shall constitute a quorum to transact business. A majority vote of the members of the Board of Regents shall prevail in all matters.

All meetings of the Board of Regents shall be open to the public. Executive

sessions of the Board may be held with the consent of a majority of those members present, and at such sessions only that business which is permitted by law to be transacted in an executive session can be considered.

The Annual Meeting will be held April 3, 1974, at 3:00 p.m.
