## SPACE RELIEF IN SIGHT FOR TSC

The TSC Board of Regents approved the leasing of a 24,800 square foot building for additional temporary quarters Wednesday afternoon during a regular meeting of the board.

The structure, located at 409 West Locust, will be leased at a rate of 10 cents per square foot per month, and the TSC Educational Foundation will be requested to provide funds for its leasing from Nov. 1, 1974 to Aug. 31, 1975. The lease will have to be funded and approved by the TSC Educational Foundation before complete plans will be made concerning the new building.

Departments which are tentatively scheduled to utilize the Locust Street building include the Business Office, offices for the dean and faculty of the School of Education and Psychology, various classrooms, an art classroom and laboratory, and a health and physical education classroom, laboratory, and training room.

President Stewart said, "The new building will offer a space relief generally throughout our institution and will enable TSC to expand its academic functions in the new building as well as the present location."

The Locust Street structure, for many years a Safeway Store, was remodeled and partitioned by its last occupant and is ready to be used.

In other action, the board approved a proposed statement on "Academic Freedom, Academic Responsibility and Tenure." The statement had earlier been composed by TSC faculty members, approved by the Texas Attorney General for its legal aspects and approved by the TSC Faculty Senate. Dr. Paxton Hart, representing the Faculty Senate, told the board, "I believe that this is a good document and that it reflects the opinion of the faculty."

Dr. Stewart emphasized the importance of the "Academic Freedom, Academic Responsibility and Tenure" statement to the board by mentioning that it was valuable in securing and retaining quality faculty members. He also mentioned that a committee had been working very hard on the statement since May, 1973.

The board also amended the Institutional Biennial Appropriations Request by \$1,187,532 for Level I and \$1,081,003 for Level II which would allow the Health and Physical Education Building to be added. The increases would also take into consideration escalation of building costs to January, 1976. They also approved the appropriations request be amended to include \$15,000 to cover the cost of moving to the new campus in 1976.





## YOUTH SEMINARS ARE SCHEDULED AT TSC

Tyler State and Region VII Education Service Center have scheduled the dates for 19 seminars designed for talented high school students in East Texas.

The first meeting of the Youth Seminar series to be held on the TSC campus will be Tuesday, Oct. 22, at 9:30 a.m.

The Department of Nursing will present the first seminar entitled "The Growing Family: Risk Reduction in Childbearing and Early Child Development."

Dates for the remaining seminars will be Oct. 29; Nov. 5, 12, 19; Dec. 3, 10; Jan. 21, 28; Feb. 4, 11, 18, 25; Mar. 4, 11, 18; and Apr. 1, 8, 15.

Each seminar will be limited to 20 participants which have already been selected by high school administrators and the Region VII Education Service Center.



## PHYSICAL PLANT OFFERS NEW SERVICE

The Physical Plant Department has implemented a new institutional service to all faculty and staff offices. Dell McLaughlin will deliver all package type mail beginning at 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. each day, Monday through Friday from the Print Shop.
