I. Governor Dolph Briscoe to Visit Tyler

II. Corrected 1974 Fall Semester Enrollment

The official enrollment for the current semester is 873 instead of the 864 number reported to you last week. This is a 72 percent increase over our enrollment one year ago. In addition to the 873 official count we have several students enrolled for non-credit work. Non-credit enrollments cannot be counted officially although these students pay regular fees.
