PRESIDENT'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS Board of Regents Meeting 4:00 p.m., February 5, 1975

1. Off-Campus Courses

Off-campus classes scheduled for the Spring Semester, 1975, total three. The possibility of these classes being conducted was reported to the Board of Regents at the January 8, 1975 meeting. All of the classes did make and include Education 566 which is being taught at Malakoff High School in Malakoff, Math 350 which is being taught at Kilgore College in Kilgore, and Education 588 at Westwood High School of the Tucker Independent School District in Palestine.

2. Twelfth Class Day Enrollment

The official twelfth class day enrollment is 1108. We are very pleased with this enrollment figure.

3. Emergency Pay Increase for State Employees

The Legislature has passed and the Governor has signed legislation increasing salaries for all state employees which, of course, includes state college and university personnel. This information has just been received and the full implications of the salary increases as they relate to Tyler State College will be given to the Board at the meeting on February 5, 1975. The information which we have unofficially at this time calls for salary increases based on the following schedule:

- . 13% per month increase for those making less than \$876 per month.
- . \$114 per month increase for those making \$876 to \$1267 per month.
- . 9% per month increase for those making \$1267 to \$1935 per month.
- . \$174 per month increase for those making more than \$1935 per month.
