BOARD OF REGENTS TO MEET WEDNESDAY; ELECTION OF NEW OFFICERS ON AGENDA

New officers of the Texas Eastern University Board of Regents will be elected at the annual meeting of the board, scheduled for 2 p.m. Wednesday in the TEU Conference Room.

The regents will elect a chairman, vice chairman and secretary. New officers take their positions immediately and serve for one year.

Other items on the agenda include the appointment of the president and a recommendation from the Academic and Personnel Committee on the reappointment of the vice president for academic affairs and vice president for fiscal affairs.

The Campus and Building Committee will present reports on Phase I construction progress, contract changes, pending revisions, Phase I Health and Physical Education facilities, and a claim against a surveyor.

The Executive Committee will recommend the election of 30 directors of the Texas Eastern University Educational Foundation, Inc.

TWO EVENTS SCHEDULED FOR LATE APRIL


Two Bicentennial Symposium events are scheduled in late April at Texas Eastern University.

Dr. Russell Long will present a program on "Fossil Man and Early Man in East Texas" at 10 a.m. on April 23.

Charles McGough will present a lecture and open a two-week art exhibit on "Contemporary American Art" at 2 p.m. on April 28.

Both programs will be in the TEU Auditorium. The art exhibit will be placed on the South Campus.

McGough is chairman of the art department of East Texas State University. His lecture will show how American artists have dominated recent developments in contemporary art. He will use slides of contemporary masters in the presentation.

CITY TAKES ACTION ON RENAMING STREETS

Three new names for streets on three sides of the permanent Texas Eastern University campus received unanimous approval of the City Plan Commission at a meeting April 1.

The proposals will go before the Tyler City Council for final action.

Spur 248 is proposed to be named University Boulevard with Old Omen Road changed to Texas Eastern Avenue and Calloway Drive changed to Patriot Avenue. These designations, upon approval, will apply in the city only. The spur will continue to have the 248 designation with the state and the Old Omen Road name would not change outside of the city limits.



BUILDING NAMED AFTER 3 MAJOR DONORS OF PERMANENT 200-ACRE CAMPUS SITE

The naming of a building on the permanent Texas Eastern University campus after three individuals who were major donors of the 200-acre campus site and the acceptance of three 50-foot flagpoles and a plaque made up the major items of action by the TEU Board of Regents at a special called meeting March 31.

The Science and Mathematics Building presently under construction will be named in honor of Isadore Roosth, George Pirtle and J. S. Hudnall, three Tyler civic leaders who contributed a major portion of the campus site.

In a related item, the regents adopted a policy of not naming a building or presenting an honorary degree to any member of the board of regents while he is still serving as a regent.

Three flagpoles are to be purchased by the TEU Educational Foundation, Inc. and placed near the entrance of the Administration Building. In addition, a plaque with the names of all original contributors to the TEU Educational Foundation and the board of directors, will be purchased by the foundation and mounted at a place to be later determined.

Dr. James H. Stewart, Jr., in his President's Report, said consideration needs to be given soon to the release of the Faculty Office Building and the facilities on Locust Street at the end of the fiscal year. The Roberts Building on Berta Street will be used two more years.

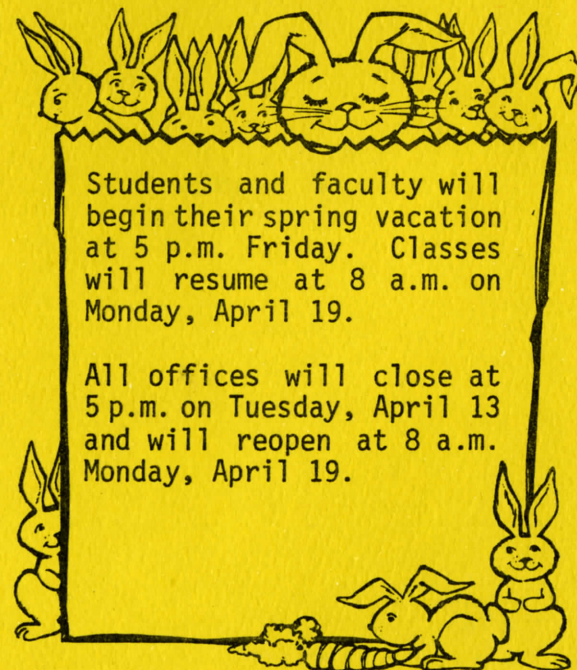
