FACULTY AND PROFESSIONAL STAFF ORIENTATION

EMPLOYEE PARKING AREAS DESIGNATED

Employees of Texas Eastern University have one full lot and portions of others reserved for parking. It was previously reported that only parking area 4 would be designated as reserved parking for faculty and staff.

Faculty, staff and handicapped parking areas are reserved in parking area 3. These areas are along the curbs on the north and south sides of the parking lot. Students and visitors may park in any space not reserved in areas 2, 3 and 6.

Reserved visitor parking is provided in area 5 with the executive officers. Visitors are to be encouraged to use these designated spaces first and park in places not reserved only when area 5 is at capacity.

Parking area 4 is reserved for faculty, staff and the handicapped. This area is not open for general parking.

Employee parking is also provided at the Physical Plant and Power Plant for those assigned to the work areas and designated by the director of physical plant and resident engineer.

Parking regulations in controlled parking areas are enforced from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. **Saturday.**

A total of 784 parking spaces are provided on the permanent campus.

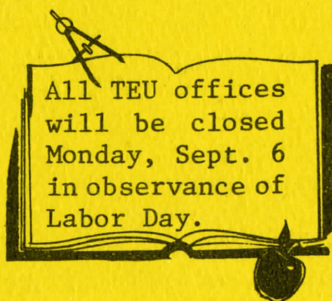
One-year options on the lease for three years following the two-year extension were also approved.

The present lease expires in 1977. Approval of the extension was given at an Aug. 19 meeting of the TISD trustees.

ELECTRIC HEATERS TO BE PICKED UP

Due to the improved heating system in the new facilities, the use of electric element heaters will not be allowed in the new quarters. The electric heaters are considered a fire hazard and increase maintenance requirements for resetting electrical breakers.

Therefore, the physical plant department will pick up all electric element heaters prior to the heating season.



SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED TO TEU STUDENTS

Six Mike Harvey Scholarships will be presented to Texas Eastern University students for the 1976-77 academic year. This is an increase of one over last year with two previous recipients receiving a second award. The scholarships were established in 1975.

The scholarships are awarded annually to eligible full-time students, on a continuing basis, who are preparing for executive secretarial positions. They are provided by M. J. Harvey of Tyler and recipients are selected by the National Secretaries Association (International) of Tyler.

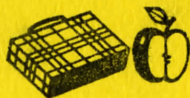
