BOARD OF REGENTS TO MEET WEDNESDAY; RESULTS OF BIDS TO BE PRESENTED

The results of bids received on the \$1,750,000 revenue bond program will be presented to the Texas Eastern University Board of Regents at a called meeting at 3 p.m. Wednesday in the Conference Room.

Bids will be opened at 11 a.m. in the office of the vice president for fiscal affairs.

Both Moody's Investors Service, Inc. and Standard and Poor's Corporation have given the bond program an "A" rating.

A report will be given by the Finance and Appropriations Committee and Sam Maclin, president of Russ Securities Corp. and financial advisor of TEU. Other items on the agenda include the consideration of four new degree programs, reports from the Campus and Building Committee, the Legal Committee and Dr. James H. Stewart, Jr.

The four proposed degrees include the Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Art, Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Music, Bachelor of Science Degree in Industrial Technology and Master of Science Degree in Psychology.

TEXAS EASTERN TO SPONSOR NAVY BAND IN TWO PERFORMANCES IN TYLER MARCH 13

The United States Navy Band of Washington, D.C. will play two concerts in Tyler March 13 under sponsorship of Texas Eastern University. The 2 p.m. Matinee and 8 p.m. performance will be in Caldwell Auditorium. The program will be one of the major bicentennial presentations by the University for the year.

Complimentary tickets are available in the Student Life Office. All segments of the TEU community--students, faculty, and staff--will have first priority for tickets through Friday, Feb. 20. Tickets are for admission only. There will be no reserved seats.

The tickets will become available to the general public on Monday, Feb. 23. The public may pick up tickets in person or send a self-addressed stamped envelope to the Student Life Office for having the tickets returned by mail.

The band offers two programs--a matinee, planned mainly for the youth, and an evening concert attuned to the taste of the adult audience.

"I am very pleased that the University can sponsor such an outstanding program for the enjoyment of our students and East Texas citizenry," President Stewart said.

John Spurgin, chairman of the TEU Bicentennial Committee, said this "presentation is of particular significance to the University because of its community-wide appeal. We feel this program will be long remembered as one of the highlights of the bicentennial celebration by all who attend."

PHYSICAL FITNESS PROGRAM SCHEDULED

A Physical Fitness Institute will be held at the South Campus of Texas Eastern University March 15-19. The Institute is sponsored by the Department of Health and Physical Education.

Seven of the 12 faculty members for the institute are representatives of Texas Eastern University.

Participating from TEU will be Joyce Ballard, Barry Green, Keith McCoy, Fred Mears and Marilyn Young from the faculty and Mary Roth and Karen Richison, two graduate assistants.

The program is designed to individualize physical fitness testing and programming.

This is the second year for the Department of Health and Physical Education to sponsor the Institute.



DR. ANTHONY SELECTED FOR THIRD TERM

Dr. Don Anthony, vice president for academic affairs, has been selected for a third term as chairman of the Christian Education Coordinating Board of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

The board, with headquarters and staff in Dallas, is responsible for general coordination of the eight colleges and one academy operated by the Convention.

Dr. Anthony is beginning the final year of a six-year term on the board.

A "Coping With the Stresses of Life Seminar" will be held Feb. 24 at First Christian Church in Tyler with the Department of Psychology of Texas Eastern University one of four sponsors.
