

I. Who's Who Students

The 19 individuals announced in January as Tyler State College's first "Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges" recipients were presented their official certificates indicating this honor last Thursday during the monthly "President's Hour" meeting. Dr. Gerald L. Morris, interim vice president for academic affairs, and Dr. Noel H. McCoy, dean of student life, assisted me in making the presentations to these outstanding students. They were selected on the basis of their scholarship, participation and leadership in academic and extracurricular activities, citizenship, service to the college and his or her promise of future usefulness.

Included in the group were 11 students from Tyler, 3 from Longview, 2 from Gilmer and 1 each from Palestine, Malakoff and Henderson. We, of course, are extremely proud of these outstanding students.

II. President's Honor Roll

A "President's Honor Roll," made up each semester of full-time students who earn all "A's," was recently initiated at our institution. The first Honor Roll list, which was released last week, included 24 students from the 1974 Fall Semester. In the future the list will be released as soon as possible following the completion of a semester. Students achieving the high distinction of earning all "A's" will be given a certificate designating them "Distinguished Students of Tyler State College."

Recognition of students who earn a place on the "President's Honor Roll" is not only an attempt to honor these students as individuals and as a group, but it is also hoped that it will encourage others to strive for a similar record of achievement.

There were 12 students from Tyler on the first "President's Honor Roll" list, 6 from Longview and 1 each from Malakoff, Palestine, Athens, Frankston, Brownsboro and Whitehouse.
