2. Recommendation for Tenure

REPORT: All work is complete on this project except

for final paving of two entrance roads near the Physical Plant which is identified as R-139. Presently the curb and gutter is in place and the final grading, including primary oil coat, is complete. Weather permitting, this work should be complete by May 1, 1977. Upon completion and receipt of cost, this revision and R-137 in the amount of \$2,881 increase (deionizer blower), R-138 in the amount of \$420 increase (modifications to return air system), R-140 in the amount of \$225 increase (calking joints on predestrian link) and R-141 in the amount of \$100 decrease (omission of two electrical outlets) will be included in the final Contract Change No. 20.

2. Construction Progress Report, Health and Physical Education Facilities

Building: Satisfactory progress is being made relative to all work activities associated with the construction of the Health and Physical Education Building. The structural steel erection is essentially complete except for handrails and miscellaneous iron work which will be added at various stages of construction. first floor slab and the second floor deck are complete. Construction has not progressed to the point where interior partitioning and other dry wall construction can begin. However, this work will be started during the month of April, 1977. The roof work is complete except for minor work required near the masonry walls. The plumbing work, including sanitary waste, vent piping and domestic water piping, is progressing well and on schedule. The concrete block work and associated brick work have been started with approximately 30 to 35 percent of the concrete block work adjacent to the power plant and approximately 45 percent of the work on the south brick wall complete.

Athletic Facilities: The contractor has finished final grading and placing of topsoil on the several athletic fields. However, because of the effects of recent rains, the contractor will have some remedial work to do later in the project. Some work has been accomplished in the areas of post setting and headers around the tennis courts. Work on the outdoor facilities has been slowed

because of the contractor's concentration on the building construction. <u>Pending Revisions</u>: At the present time there is one revision under consideration that will exceed \$2,000: R-22, Treatment of final grade on athletic fields. ITEM XIII.

CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS REPORT, PHASE I

Regent Velvin reported that all work is complete on this project except for final paving of two entrance roads near the Physical Plant which is identified as R-139. Presently the curb and gutter is in place and the final grading, including primary oil coat, is complete. This work should be complete by May 1, 1977. Upon completion and receipt of cost, this revision and R-137 in the amount of \$2,881 increase (deionizer blower) R-138 in the amount of \$420 increase (modifications to return air system), R-140 in the amount of \$225 increase (calking joints on predestrian link) and R-141 in the amount of \$100 decrease (omission of two electrical outlets) will be included in the final Contract Change No. 20.

BOARD ACTION: Received as information.

ITEM XIV. CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS REPORT, HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION FACILITIES

Regent Velvin gave the following report relative to construction progress on health and physical education facilities:

Building: Satisfactory progress is being made relative to all work activities associated with the construction of the Health and Physical Education Building. The structural steel erection is essentially complete except for handrails and miscellaneous iron work which will be added at various stages

of construction. The first floor slab and the second floor deck are complete. Construction has not progressed to the point where interior partitioning and other dry wall construction can begin. However, this work is scheduled to begin during the latter part of April, 1977. The roof work is complete except for minor work required near the masonry walls. The plumbing work, including sanitary waste, vent piping and domestic water piping, is progressing well and on schedule. The concrete block work and associated brick work have been started with approximately 30 to 35 percent of the concrete block work adjacent to the power plant and approximately 45 percent of the work on the south brick wall complete.

Athletic Facilities: The contractor has finished final grading and placing of topsoil on the several athletic fields. However, because of the effects of recent rains, the contractor will have some remedial work to do later in the project. Some work has been accomplished in the areas of post setting and headers around the tennis courts. Work on the outdoor facilities has been slowed because of the contractor's concentration on the building construction.

<u>Pending Revisions</u>: At the present time there is one revision under consideration that will exceed \$2,000: R-22, Treatment of final grade on athletic fields.

BOARD ACTION: Received as information.

ITEM XV.

RATIFICATION OF COMMITTEE ACTION

Regent Austin reported that the Campus and Building Committee met with representatives of Geren Associates Architects Engineers Planners following the March 16, 1977 Board of Regents meeting as authorized by the Board of Regents during that meeting to make necessary decisions for granting final approval to Phase II construction plans and specifications.

ITEM XVI.

STATUS OF ENTRANCE SIGN

Regent McKenzie inquired into the present status of the Texas Eastern University entrance sign planned for the Old Omen Road entrance to the campus. Vice President Sawyer reported that the Phase I architect, Caudill Rowlett Scott, Inc., had been unable to submit an acceptable design for the entrance sign. Consequently, the project had been delegated to the Phase II architect, Geren Associates Architects Engineers Planners, with whom members of the university administration were to meet on April 14, 1977.

BOARD ACTION: Received as information.

Regent Abernathy provided each board member with a quarterly financial report for the period September 1, 1976 through February 28, 1977 which will initiate a new and comprehensive fiscal reporting system to the Board of Regents which it is hoped will eventually replace the monthly listing of bills paid which was initiated as an interim reporting measure during the early months of operation of the university.

BOARD ACTION: Regent Abernathy moved and Regent McVicker seconded that the Board of Regents be furnished with the newly-distributed quarterly financial report by the university administration in addition to the monthly listing of expenses presently being mailed to board members. Motion carried with Regent Turner and Regent Austin voting opposed.

ITEM XVIII. PRESIDENT'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

President Stewart gave the following oral report based on a previously submitted written report and recommendations:

1. Approval of 1977 May Commencement Graduates

The listing of Texas Eastern University graduates for the May 14, 1977 Annual Commencement (Attachment A) has been completed and the Board of Regents' approval of these individuals to receive the degrees for which they have filed contingent upon their completing all requirements by the end of the current semester is recommended. The faculty, Deans Council and vice president for academic affairs of Texas Eastern University have certified that the students named are completing curricula offered by the several schools and departments of TEU, and it is an honor for me to recommend to the Board of Regents that these degree candidates be awarded the appropriate degrees with all rights and privileges pertaining thereto in recognition of their academic accomplishments and that each student named be awarded the designated baccalaureate or master's degree during the 1977 Annual Commencement program to be conducted at Harvey Hall, Tyler, Texas on May 14, 1977 at 2:00 p.m.

The total number of graduates presently anticipated for the 1977 Annual Commencement is 335 with 84 students having completed degree requirements during the Summer Semester 1976; 93, during the Fall Semester 1976 and 158, during the Spring Semester 1977.

There is a total of 251 bachelor's degrees and 84 master's degrees with the School of Applied Studies reporting 52 bachelor's degrees and 1 master's degree, the School of Business Administration reporting 54 bachelor's degrees and 3 master's degrees, the School of Education and Psychology reporting 71 bachelor's degrees and 70 master's degrees, the School of Fine and Performing Arts reporting 6 bachelor's

degrees and 7 master's degrees, the School of Humanities and Social Sciences reporting 65 bachelor's degrees and 3 master's degrees and the School of Sciences and Mathematics reporting 3 bachelor's degrees.

BOARD ACTION: Regent Abernathy moved and Regent McVicker seconded that the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the university president, approve each degree candidate to receive his/her recommended degree contingent upon each degree candidate successfully completing the requirements for his/her degree; furthermore, that each approved degree candidate named in Attachment A be awarded the designated baccalaureate or master's degree during the Annual Commencement program on May 14, 1977 at 2:00 p.m. in Harvey Hall. Motion carried unanimously.

2. University Catalog for 1977-78

As you will recall, the 1977-78 Texas Eastern University Catalog was sent to each member of the board on April 4, 1977. We of the university staff are very pleased with the fifth edition of the university catalog, and I am especially appreciative to J. Archie Whitfield, director of the Office of Public Information, for the excellent work performed in coordinating publication of this important document. This publication will serve the university well during the 1977-78 period; therefore, I hereby recommend the 1977-78 Texas Eastern University Catalog to the Board of Regents for approval.

BOARD ACTION: Regent Schleier moved and Regent Turner seconded that the Board of Regents, upon the recommendation of the university president, approve the 1977-78 Texas Eastern University Catalog. Motion carried unanimously.

3. Texas Community and Junior College Scholarships

Texas Eastern University awarded scholarships to eleven students from nine institutions under the Texas Eastern University Educational Foundation, Inc. Community and Junior College Scholarship program for the Spring Semester 1977. Participating colleges and their respective awards, which vary in amount according to individual course loads, are as follows:

Since the State Auditors Office requires the institution to have cash on hand prior to issuing financial aid such as is provided through the foundation scholarship program, our business office estimated the amount needed for community and junior college scholarships for the Spring Semester 1977 to be \$2,700.00. Accordingly, \$1,949.00 (the estimated \$2,700.00 less a \$751.00 balance on hand) was requested from the foundation under authority previously established by the Board of Regents.

It is anticipated that \$496.00 will be required to fund the community and junior college scholarships for six students during the Summer I Semester 1977; however, there will be no request for additional funds from the foundation at this time since there is a balance on hand of \$833.50.

4. TEU Honors Day Program

Since the beginning of Texas Eastern University, a goal has existed to recognize outstanding student accomplishment. Although periodic recognition has been given to certain specific honors, it has been our objective to grant recognition on a more formal and public basis. An annual honors day appears to be an appropriate way of meeting this objective. In view of this fact, the Student Life area, in conjunction with the academic departments, has planned an honors day program for the university.

It is therefore my pleasure to announce the first annual Texas Eastern University Honors Day scheduled for Tuesday, May 3, 1977 from 10:25 to 11:20 a.m. in the University Center. Numerous honors and recognitions will be conveyed as a part of the program, which is to be climaxed by presentation of the prestigious Watson W. Wise Incentive Award.

5. Coordinating Board Meeting, April 22, 1977

Scheduled for consideration at the April 22, 1977 meeting of the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System are two matters relative to Texas Eastern University:

Approval of the Bachelor of Science Degree with a major in Industrial Education

Approval of the establishment of a Department of Industrial Education

As you will recall, board approval of the Bachelor of Science Degree in Industrial Education was granted on February 18, 1976 pending approval of the Coordinating Board at the April 23, 1976 meeting. Prior to that meeting one year ago, however, the Coordinating Board declared a moratorium on new programs

throughout the state; and therefore, this degree proposal was not recommended for approval by the Coordinating Board Program Development Committee.

Board approval of the establishment of the Department of Industrial Education and the Department of Technology within the School of Applied Studies was granted on January 21, 1976 and subsequent board approval was given on January 19, 1977 that the Department of Technology be absorbed into the Department of Industrial Education within the School of Applied Studies.

BOARD ACTION: Received as information.

6. Acknowledgement of Flowers Received

An acknowledgement has been received from the family of Mrs. Marianna Smith thanking members of the board and university personnel for the expression of sympathy. Mrs. Smith was the wife of Dr. Tom E. Smith, member of the Texas Eastern University Educational Foundation, Inc. Board of Directors, and mother of Mrs. Marianna Powell, secretary in the Office of the President.

7. Expression of Appreciation

President Stewart expressed his appreciation to the Board of Regents for the opportunity to serve as president for the ensuing year, September 1, 1977 through August 31, 1978, as approved earlier in the meeting.

DEDICATION OF MIKE HARVEY LAKE

Regent Schleier reported that the Mike Harvey Lake Dedication Committee met on April 1, 1977 to plan a symbolic presentation of the lake to the university. Regent McKenzie moved and Regent Abernathy seconded that the Board of Regents adopt a resolution for the excellent work accomplished by Regent Schleier in his capacity as Chairman of the Board of Regents for the past year, April 14, 1976 to April 13, 1977, and that this recognition be recorded in the Minutes of the Board of Regents. Motion carried unanimously.
