BOARD OF REGENTS TO MEET WEDNESDAY

The Texas Eastern University Board of Regents will meet at 3 p.m. Wednesday in the newly-furnished board room on the third floor of the Administration Building. A full agenda has been prepared for the quarterly meeting of the governing board.

Regents will consider a recommendation of the Executive Committee covering an administrative expense account. Personnel additions, changes and terminations will be presented by the Academic and Personnel Committee.

Items to be discussed by the Campus and Building Committee include construction progress reports on Phase I and the health and physical education facilities, plans for Phase II and contract changes.

A revised request for legislative appropriations for the fiscal years ending Aug. 31, 1978 and 1979 will be reviewed by the Finance and Appropriations Committee.

The Legal Committee will present three contract items for consideration.

The President's Report and Recommendations of nine items will include several students speaking to the regents to relate information about their instructional and other experiences at the university.

21 TALENTED YOUTH SEMINARS SCHEDULED AT TEU FOR 1976-77 ACADEMIC YEAR

Twenty-one Talented Youth Seminars are scheduled at Texas Eastern University during the 1976-77 academic year.

The programs, conducted in cooperation with the Region VII Education Service Center in Kilgore, begin Oct. 19 with Dr. Stephen E. Daniels discussing the topic "Me Push A Candidate?" Seminars will continue through May 3.

Meetings will be from 9:30-11:30 a.m. on a Tuesday in UC 134.

All schools within the university are participating in the seminars with the School of Education and Psychology conducting six, the School of Humanities and Social Sciences five, School of Sciences and Mathematics four, School of Business Administration three, School of Fine and Performing Arts two, and the School of Applied Studies one.

The political picture will be featured at the Oct. 26 seminar with Dr. Terry Busson and Dr. Vincent J. Falzone discussing "Making of the President, 1976."



STATISTICS ON 1976 FALL ENROLLMENT

Just over half of the students enrolled at Texas Eastern University for the fall semester are juniors, according to statistics provided by the office of admissions and records.

A total of 759 of the 1504 students are juniors. This is 50.46 percent of the student body.

Seniors total 265 or 17.61 percent. Enrollment in post baccalaureate courses totals 237 or 15.75 percent while enrollment in master degree programs is 243 or 16.15 percent.

Females outnumber males by 113 with a majority of this difference in the master degree program.

? THE QUESTION BOX ?

QUESTION: Are the mail drawers located just outside the University Center for use by employees and students or strictly for university mail?

ANSWER: Business Manager Wayne Criswell says the mail drawers outside the university mail room may be used for personal outgoing mail as well as official university mail. However, this practice is not encour-

116 TEXAS EASTERN EMPLOYEES RESPOND TO UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN OF TYLER

United Way pledges from Texas Eastern University employees for the 1976 campaign total \$1,448.20 with 116 of the 186 employees responding.

The total pledged is \$258.30 short of the \$1,706.50 given in 1975.

Co-chairmen Archie Whitfield and Dr. Bob Cranford are requesting all pledge cards be returned by Friday to close the drive.

Six of 22 offices have reported 100 percent. These include the office of the president, office of vice president for fiscal affairs, office of institutional planning and analysis, office of business manager, public information office and office of traffic safety. Seventy employees have not responded.

329 HAVE EARNED BACHELOR'S DEGREES

Bachelor degrees have been earned by 329 students at Texas Eastern University in just over three and one-half years. A total of 455 degrees have been awarded with 72 percent of those on the undergraduate level.

Nine students were the first graduates in the spring of 1974. The highest singlesemester degree production on the undergraduate level was the spring of 1975 when 88 students completed degree requirements.

Degrees have been earned in 25 academic areas with elementary education the leader with 84 graduates. Secondary education places second with 38. Other fields with the number of graduates through the summer of 1976 include criminal justice 28, sociology 24, accounting 24, management 16, business administration 16, history 15, English 11, health and physical education 11, political science 10, psychology 9, applied arts and sciences 7, marketing 7, speech 6, mathematics 4, music 3, finance 3, art 3, biology 3, medical technology 2, computer science 2, and journalism 1, economics 1, and drama 1.

TEU STUDENTS TO CONDUCT EVALUATIONS

Under the supervision of faculty, students at Texas Eastern University are conducting evaluations of children and adults who are experiencing learning difficulties.

Evaluations are done in conjunction with course work in learning disabilities, reading, health and physical education, and psychology offered at the university.

In an effort to provide positive direction for academic planning, assessment is based on observation, history data and clinical tests. Results are communicated to parents and suggested intervention techniques are provided for school personnel upon the parent's request.

Requests for additional information and/or appointments should be directed to Dr. Mac R. Moseley. Appointments will be scheduled through the spring semester in the order in which they are received.

EMPLOYEES COMPLETE FIRST AID COURSE

Nine Texas Eastern University employees recently completed an eight-hour course in first aid training sponsored by the American Red Cross.

In case of an emergency requiring first aid, one of the nine or the University Police should be called. Officers of the university police are also trained in first aid assistance.

TWO GRANTS AWARDED TO TEXAS EASTERN

Two grants totaling \$45,395 have been awarded to Texas Eastern University for the 1976-77 academic year.

A Basic Educational Opportunity Grant (BEOG) totals \$30,000 and a Law Enforcement Educational Program (LEEP) award is \$15,395.

The BEOG award is up \$19,312 from last year's total and Financial Aid Officer Donald Zackary is requesting an additional \$53,552 to complete the present academic year. The \$30,000 grant provides assistance to 119 students. Eighteen students participated in the program last year.

The LEEP grant is an increase of \$1,215 over last year. The program was established by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration to make money available for law enforcement officer training. The purpose was to help officers already in service continue their education.
