PRELIMINARY PHASE II BUILDING PLANS APPROVED BY TEU BOARD OF REGENTS

Preliminary design documents for the Phase II facilities were approved at an Oct. 20 meeting of the Texas Eastern University Board of Regents. Phase II general construction will include two classroom buildings, two parking lots and street improvements.

Final plans and specifications are due for completion in February with construction expected to begin in April. Fifteen months of construction time is projected.

Both buildings will be two-story structures and will be similar in design features as the Phase I facilities. The Business Administration Building, to be located on the west side of the upper lake, is to include classrooms and faculty offices.

The Sciences and Mathematics Building, to be an addition to the present facility, is to include classrooms and laboratories for zoology, microbiology, biochemistry, biology and physics plus an electron microscope laboratory, three environmental rooms, a chemical storage room, a radioactive storage room, an animal room, an optics laboratory and a photographic studio.

Five TEU students gave their views and impressions of the university at the quarterly board meeting. They were Rita Colvin, Ross John Cox, Rene Ferrell, Debra Posey and Freeman Sterling.

Personnel matters receiving approval include the addition of three professional full-time employees, 28 professional part-time employees, 38 classified full-time employees, nine changes in position and 14 terminations. Among the position changes is the promotion of Dr. Mac R. Moseley to chairman of the Department of Special Services.

A reduction in the request for legislative appropriations by \$441,719 for the fiscal years ending Aug. 31, 1978 and 1979 was approved by the regents.

FIVE SEMINARS SCHEDULED IN NOVEMBER

Five Talented Youth Seminars are scheduled for November on the Texas Eastern University campus with a total of 221 students expected to participate.

The seminars, presented by members of the TEU faculty in cooperation with the Region VII Education Service Center in Kilgore, are for outstanding high school seniors.

Dr. Stephen E. Daniels opened the seminar series on Oct. 19 with 12 students discussing campaign strategies. Dr. Terry Busson and Dr. Vincent J. Falzone presented "Making of the President, 1976," Tuesday with 54 students attending.

Students attending the October seminars were from Lindale, New Diana, Robert E. Lee, Whitehouse, Athens, Brownsboro, Canton, Hallsville, Kilgore, Malakoff, Quitman, Tatum and John Tyler.

CAMPAIGN PLEDGES REACH ALL-TIME HIGH

Pledges for the 1976 United Way campaign reached an all-time high for Texas Eastern University personnel this week with only 19 cards needed to be returned to complete the drive.

A total of \$1,902.20 has been pledged by the 168 employees responding. TEU employees contributed \$1,706.50 last year. The number of employees at TEU, however, has grown from 121 to 187.




