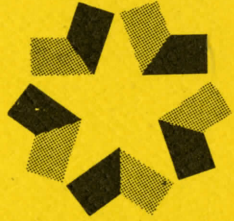

FIRST HONORS DAY PROGRAM SCHEDULED TUESDAY, MAY 3, IN UNIVERSITY CENTER

The first Texas Eastern University Honors Day program is scheduled for 10:25-11:20 a.m. Tuesday, May 3, in the University Center.

Numerous honors and recognitions will be conveyed as a part of the program.

A highlight will be the presentation of the Watson W. Wise Incentive Award. This is a cash gift to a student completing baccalaureate degree requirements at TEU. The award is based on qualities of scholarship, character, citizenship and civic responsibility.

Dr. Tom G. Turns is coordinating the program and will serve as master of ceremonies. Also participating will be Regent David K. McKie, chairman of the board of regents, Dr. Donald M. Anthony, Dr. David Riddle, Mrs. Olene Harned and Dr. James H. Stewart, Jr.

Classes will be dismissed from 10:15-11:30 a.m. to encourage attendance of faculty and students.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE/CREATION OF NEW DEPARTMENT RECEIVE APPROVAL

Texas Eastern University received approval of the Bachelor of Science degree in industrial education and the creation of a Department of Industrial Education at a meeting of the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University, April 22.

To be implemented in September, the new degree provides six options in a cluster concept. These include industrial technology, technical, vocational industrial, industrial distribution, industrial arts and industrial safety.

Dr. Donald M. Anthony, in announcing action of the Coordinating Board, said "we are very pleased with action of the Coordinating Board in approving this degree. The program represents a broadening of TEU's curriculum into a new area which will be very significant in serving the educational and industrial needs."

Attending the board meeting in Austin were Dr. James H. Stewart, Jr. and Dr. Anthony.

David K. McKie of Tyler is the new chairman of the Texas Eastern University Board of Regents. He was elected as the board's sixth chairman at the annual meeting April 13.

Other new officers include Neal E. Velvin of Athens as vice chairman and Jeff Austin, Jr. of Jacksonville as secretary.

Bylaws of the board were amended to provide that officers may succeed themselves, if elected, for one additional term or a total period of consecutive service of not more than two years.

335 TEXAS EASTERN STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR COMMENCEMENT SCHEDULED MAY 14

Elementary education is the leading academic area for the 335 Texas Eastern University students who have filed for degrees and are eligible to participate in the fourth annual commencement.

The commencement program is scheduled for 2 p.m. Saturday, May 14, in Harvey Hall.

Thirty academic areas are represented among the graduates with 48 elementary education majors. Second is sociology with 29. General business and secondary education each have 22 graduates while reading has 21. Criminal justice and curriculum and instruction have 20 each.

Smith County has the largest number of residents with 196, or 58 percent of the group. Gregg County ranks second with 35, followed by Henderson County with 23, Cherokee County with 17 and Anderson County with 15. A total of 17 counties are represented.

The 1977 graduating class is almost evenly divided between males and females with 174 females and 161 males.
