I. University Bicentennial Event

Just prior to the Board of Regents meeting Wednesday, September 17, 1975 at 2:30 p.m., we have scheduled a brief ceremony during which our nation's Bicentennial Flag will be raised on our university flag pole for the first time. CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS REPORT

Week Ending: September 12, 1975

General:

All work requirements are progressing satisfactorily and in general on schedule including the site work.

Power Plant:

Very little work was accomplished in this facility this week due to the concentration on the underground Perma-Pipe systems---efforts are being made to install

this pipe prior to fall rains.

Student Center: Drywall work continues with taping in process. Also, considerable progress was made in the window-wall work. Installation of "T-bar" ceiling system has also started.

Administration: Brick work and drywall work continues without incident along with air handler piping and duct work. Brick work on the Auditorium and exterior stairs is near complete with overall completion on the brick work at approximately 70%.

Science/Math.:

Exterior sheeting continues along with interior mechanical and electrical work. Roof work is also in progress and nearing completion.

Physical Plant: The roofing contractor has begun his work but progress is not significant at this time.

Site Work:

Curb/gutter and road/parking lot work is progressing well, including light standards and underground electrical cable.
