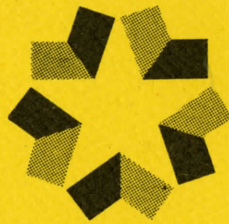

## VPAA ADVISORY COMMITTEE APPOINTED; JULY 15 DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS

A five member Advisory Committee has been appointed by Dr. James H. Stewart, Jr. to assist in the search for a new vice president for academic affairs.

Dr. George Joyce, the Deans Council representative, will chair the group. Other members include Dr. John H. Spurgin as president of the Faculty Senate, Dr. Barbara A. Sears as a faculty representative, Mrs. Deborah Ann Carter as a student representative and John R. Sawyer.

Letters of application and supporting data should be submitted to N. Wayne Williams no later than July 15. A target date of Sept. 1 has been established for the new vice president to take office. If this time schedule is met, it is anticipated that no interim appointment will be necessary.

Since Dr. Donald M. Anthony announced his plans to resign, Dr. Stewart has met individually with all deans and the president of the faculty senate to discuss the job, including the criteria and selection process. He also met with the Deans Council last week.

A communication was sent Tuesday by President Stewart to each member of the TEU faculty announcing appointments to the Advisory Committee and providing information concerning the position.

In the memorandum, he invited faculty members to submit names of qualified individuals who may be interested to Williams. Upon receiving names of individuals from faculty members, Williams will furnish prospective applicants with the necessary information to apply for the position. All returned applications will be provided to the VPAA Advisory Committee.

"The primary objective is to bring the best qualified person available into this position," Dr. Stewart said.

The Advisory Committee is charged with the responsibility of reviewing applications and of evaluating and categorizing applicants for the purpose of assisting in the selection of a VPAA.

## DR. DONALD ANTHONY RESIGNS AS VPAA

Dr. Donald M. Anthony was officially named director of the Texas Baptists' Christian Education Coordinating Board at a Tuesday meeting of the Executive Board of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

His resignation as vice president for academic affairs for Texas Eastern University will be effective July 15.

The CECB coordinates work of eight Baptist colleges and universities in Texas, one academy and about 89 Baptist student unions located on college campuses. The board is composed of 15 pastors and lay people.

Dr. Anthony will have an office on the second floor of the Baptist Building in downtown Dallas.

Contributions to the Dr. W. Carl Roddy Memorial Fund total \$810, according to records in the accounting office. This is the total received through Tuesday.

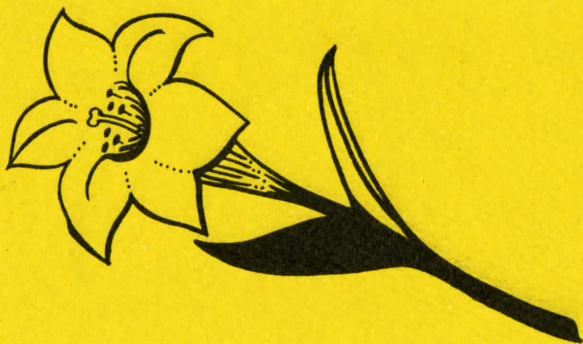
A decision on the use of the memorial will be made at a later date. Officials say the use will be for a lasting memorial related to an aspect of the university which was close to Dr. Roddy.

## FULL ACCREDITATION BY STATE BOARD RECEIVED BY TEU'S NURSING PROGRAM

The Texas Eastern University nursing program has received full accreditation by the State Board of Nurse Examiners.

Accreditation of the program was mandatory by state law for continued operation.

Five health agencies also received board approval for student clinical experience. These are the East Texas Chest Hospital, Medical Center Hospital, Mother Frances Hospital, Schlesingers Home Health Service Agency and the Tyler-Smith County Public Health Department.

Strengths of the program cited in the board's report include administrative and community support of the program, nurse faculty representation on university-wide committees, the use of innovative teaching approaches and leadership capabilities of the director.

Enrollment in the nursing program for the spring semester was 122, up from 67 the previous semester.

## SUMMER I ENROLLMENT CLIMBS TO 839

Enrollment for the first summer term reached a record high of 839 at noon Wednesday, surpassing the previous high of 831 set in 1976.

The final and official enrollment figure will not be available until after the fourth class day.

## TWO LECTURES SLATED FOR SUMMER TERM

Two lectures on intercultural relationships will be presented during the first summer term. The lectures are scheduled for 2 p.m. June 7 and 15 in ADM 127. They are free and open for anyone interested in attending.

"Stereotyping the American Indian" will be the subject presented by Dr. Alfonso Ortiz on June 7. Dr. Ortiz, a professor of anthropology at the University of New Mexico, is a native American Indian and has written extensively on the Pueblo Indians of the Southwest. He taught at Rutgers and Princeton before moving to NMU in 1974.

Dr. Alfred G. Smith will talk on "Conflicts Among Texas Cultures" at the June 15 program. He is a professor and director of the Center for Communication Research at the University of Texas at Austin.

Dr. Smith taught at Antioch College, Emory University and the University of Oregon before arriving at UT in 1973.
