VPAA ADVISORY COMMITTEE EVALUATES APPLICATIONS FOR EXECUTIVE POSITION

The Vice President for Academic Affairs Advisory Committee is approximately 75 to 80 percent complete on its first evaluation of all applications for the position, according to the committee chairman, George Joyce.

A total of 98 inquiries from 33 states and Canada were received in the personnel office. Of this group, 41 individuals from 21 states completed the application process.

Joyce said each committee member is completing a standard evaluation form after independently reviewing the folder of each applicant. In addition, they have been meeting as a group on a weekly basis for purposes of planning.

"The charge to the committee is to review, evaluate and categorize each applicant for the purpose of assisting in the selection of a vice president for academic affairs. The committee has set four categories which include most acceptable, acceptable, least acceptable and unacceptable. Each member is making this evaluation independently." Joyce said.

After evaluations are complete, a summary report will be made to the president identifying the people in each category.

Members of the committee include Joyce, Deborah Ann Carter, John R. Sawyer, Barbara A. Sears and John H. Spurgin.

"Each member recognizes he or she is a representative of a unit of the university community and is pursuing the issue with conscientiousness and diligence," Joyce added.



BOARD OF REGENTS TO MEET WEDNESDAY

The Texas Eastern University Board of Regents will meet in a special called meeting at 3 p.m. Wednesday with a report from the Campus and Building Committee concerning the selection of an architect for the library (Part A) project a major item for consideration.

Funding for Part A of the library project will become available September 1.

In other items, the Finance and Appropriations Committee will present reports concerning the purchase of equipment for upgrading the data processing capabilities and the printing capabilities of the university.

Contracts to be considered include PBX service and an agreement with the University of Texas at Austin Film Library.

Other reports will concern personnel, construction progress and enrollment.

ENROLLMENT FOR SUMMER II TOTALS 694

Enrollment for the second summer term is 694, according to records in the office of admissions and records. Compared to Summer II 1976 enrollment of 713, the present figure is a decrease of 2.7 percent. The 1976 figure included 105 students in a special graduate seminar, "Law and a Changing Society."

Juniors set the pace with 35.82 percent of the enrollment. Seniors account for 21.43 percent of the students and 42.72 of the students are taking graduate courses.

In other statistics on Summer II students, the ages range from 18 to 67 with 25 counties, 9 states and 4 foreign countries represented.



NOTES FROM THE PERSONNEL OFFICE

Texas Eastern University employees covered by the group policy with Blue Cross and Blue Shield should notify the personnel office promptly when any change in the employee's family occurs.

Forms are available in the personnel office to provide for changes in coverage due to marriage, a birth of a child or whenever any other change in the makeup of a family occurs. These forms should be completed within 30 days of a change in family status.
