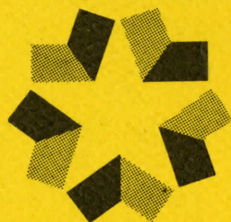

## BOARD OF REGENTS TO MEET WEDNESDAY; 1978 BUDGET MAJOR ITEM OF BUSINESS

The Texas Eastern University Board of Regents will meet at 3 p.m. Wednesday with the budget for fiscal year 1978 one of the major items for consideration.

Three new degree proposals are to be presented for board action. These include a B.A./B.S. degree in communication, a M.S. in industrial education and a M.A./M.Ed. degree in special education.

Other items on the agenda include inter-agency cooperation contracts, personnel, selection of depository bank, a quarterly financial report and tuition schedule and matriculation fee.

Subjects relative to the campus and building program include a construction progress report, contract changes, entrance/identification signs, Phase II campus plan and selection of architect for the library (Part A).

In his president's report, Dr. James H. Stewart, Jr. will discuss enrollment, summer convocation, reappointment of present institutional personnel, faculty research projects, area traffic engineer and nursing program accreditation.

## TEU SETS PACE WITH 291 FIRST TIME TRANSFER STUDENTS IN FALL OF 1976

Texas Eastern University set the pace among Texas colleges and universities for total transfer students from four East Texas junior colleges in the fall of 1976.

TEU received 291 first time transfer students from Tyler Junior College, Kilgore College, Henderson County Junior College and Panola Junior College in the fall semester.

These records were compiled by the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System.

Stephen F. Austin State University ranks second with 196 transfer students from the four schools while East Texas State University and Texas A&M are tied for third with 129 each.

Tyler JC transfers to TEU total 176 with 64 selecting A&M. Texas Eastern also was the choice of 38 students from HCJC. Second was ETSU with 35. SFA was the leader for Kilgore and Panola students, getting 84 compared to TEU's 73 from Kilgore and 40 compared to a second place of 9 by Sam Houston State. Texas Eastern enrolled 4 Panola graduates.

## SUMMER II REGISTRATION SET JULY 8

Registration for the second summer term of 1977 will be held from 1-7 p.m. July 7 with classes to start July 8.

Late registration and schedule changes start July 8 and conclude on July 11.

Summer convocation will be held August 11 with final examinations scheduled August 12.

## SUMMER I ENROLLMENT DATA RELEASED

Students from 30 counties, 12 states and 6 foreign countries are included in the 875 enrollment for Summer I, according to data released by the Admissions and Records office.

Smith County accounts for 55.54 percent of the students. Other counties and percentages for the top nine include Gregg (11.65), Henderson (6.40), Anderson (4.80), Rusk (4.11), Cherokee (3.88), Upshur (3.31), Van Zandt (2.40) and Wood (1.25).

Summer I enrollment includes 313 (35%) juniors, 159 (18%) seniors and 403 (45%) graduate students. Females outnumber males 499 to 376.

## CONSTRUCTION ADDS TO TRAFFIC HAZARDS

Construction of Phase II facilities will be underway throughout the 1977-78 academic year.

"Travel conditions on the street where the construction is in progress are not ideal," said L. J. Grubbs. "We have large trucks on the street almost daily. When wet, the street is extremely slick."

He said the street will remain open to university traffic but suggested that motorists try to avoid its use. He also advised that anyone who must travel on the street should use precaution to avoid an accident.

## TEX-AN CALL PROCEDURE IS OUTLINED

An important feature of the TEX-AN network is its capability of accepting calls placed from a station off the network to a station on the network. Here is the proper procedure for using this feature:

--Locate the nearest TEX-AN operator number from the Official State Directory or from the Travelers Guide. If the nearest TEX-AN operator number is in the city from where you are calling, the call will be a local call. If the TEX-AN operator number is located in a distant city, the call will be placed on a long distance call, using your telephone credit card, special billing number, bill to a third number, or one-plus dialing.

--When the TEX-AN operator answers, announce that your call is a TEX-AN call.

--Give the TEX-AN operator your name and agency code or agency name.

--Give the TEX-AN operator the TEX-AN number and the call will be completed.
