Flag Raising Ceremony Scheduled Tuesday

A flag raising ceremony will be held at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday, June 27 to mark the first flying of the Texas Eastern University flag. The new flag was displayed for the first time at the fifth annual commencement on May 20.

Classes will be dismissed at 10:20 a.m. to make possible attendance by students and faculty. All Texas Eastern employees are invited to attend the ceremony. Any office may be closed for the purpose of attending the brief program. All incoming telephone calls will be stopped at the switch-board unless Ellen Hogan is notified that individual offices will remain open. Offices will reopen immediately following the ceremony and classes will resume at the regular time of 10:50 a.m.

The ceremony has been planned under the direction of the student life office. Program participants will include James H. Stewart, Jr., Wendell C. Hewett, representing the Faculty Senate, and Charles Angelico, chairman of SLAC representing the student body. Students will display the flag and participate in raising it for the first time.

The flag features the school colors of blue and green and includes the seal and Texas Eastern University in 7½ inch letters above and below the seal.

Summer II Registration Set For July 10, 1-7 p.m.

Registration for the second summer session is scheduled for July 10 with classes to begin July 11.

Registration will be held from 1-7 p.m. with late registration scheduled from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on July 11-12.

A total of 141 students participated in early registration for the second summer term. The second term schedule includes 81 classes with 68 of those offered during the day and 13 at night. The 81 include 33 graduate and 48 undergraduate courses.

TEU Site Of Regional Workshop

Texas Eastern University has been selected as the site of a regional workshop to be conducted by the State Comptroller's office. The one day workshop will be held July 7.

The purpose of the workshop is to discuss agency accounting problems and newly implemented fiscal procedures. Emphasis will also be placed on the vendor file project.

It is estimated that 40 people will be in attendance with various state agencies, such as Rusk State Hospital, East Texas State University, Lufkin State School, Crockett State School, and Stephen F. Austin State University to be represented in addition to the Texas Eastern University fiscal staff.

All Texas Eastern University offices will be closed Tuesday, July 4, for a holiday.

Classes will be dismissed at 10 p.m. Monday and will resume at 7:30 a.m. Wednesday.
