1978 Fall Convocation To Honor 142 Students

The 1978 Fall Convocation program is scheduled for 4 p.m. Friday, Dec. 8 in room 122 of the Physical and Health Education Building. Students who are completing degree requirements this semester will be recognized at the program and honored with a reception.

Texas Eastern University has 142 candidates for degrees this semester, including 32 for master's degrees and 110 for bachelor's degrees. Master's degree candidates include 13 in interdisciplinary studies, 3 in business administration and 16 in education and psychology.

All six schools have candidates for bachelor's degrees.

The 142 candidates represent the largest number of potential graduates in a fall semester for Texas Eastern. The current record is 114 set in the fall of 1977.

James H. Stewart Jr. will preside at the convocation. Participants will include the five academic deans and Donald W. Whisenhunt.

Ballard, Young Are TEU Piper Nominees For 1979

Joyce E. Ballard and Marilyn Young are the Texas Eastern University nominees for consideration by the Minnie Stevens Piper Foundation as 1979 Piper Professors.

The foundation honors 10 professors on a statewide basis each year for outstanding academic, scientific and scholarly achievement, and for their dedication to the teaching profession. A facultystudent Piper Committee, chaired by Andrew S. Szarka, acted on nominations submitted by TEU faculty and students and submitted two nominees to the Faculty Senate for endorsement with a final review and approval given by President James H. Stewart Jr.

Ballard, an associate professor of health and physical education, joined the TEU faculty in September 1975. She has 17 years teaching experience.

Young is an associate professor of business administration and coordinator of the MBA program at TEU. She joined the faculty in September 1974 and has 10 years teaching experience.
