Cranford Speaker For Commencement

Robert H. Cranford will be the commencement speaker for the 1979 Texas Eastern University graduation program. The selection of the speaker was announced Monday by President James H. Stewart, Jr. The 1979 commencement is scheduled for 2 p.m. Saturday, May 12, in Harvey Hall.

Cranford joined the TEU faculty in June 1973 as an associate professor of mathematics. He was promoted to professor of mathematics and chairman of the Department of Mathematics and Computer Science in 1976.

The Rev. Eugene Whitley, senior minister at First Christian Church, will give the invocation and the Rev. J. Pittman McGehee, rector of Christ Episcopal Church will give the benediction.

Larry Marta, a 1976 Texas Eastern University graduate with a Master of Arts degree, will serve as organist for the program.

Other program participants include Dean W. Turner representing the board of regents, President Stewart, Donald W. Whisenhunt, W. A. Mayfield, George Joyce, Robert L. Cox, Frank H. Smyrl and L. Lynn Sherrod.

TEU/UT Legislation Clears Two Steps

Legislation moving Texas Eastern University into the University of Texas System passed two of five major steps within the past week and could clear a third step today (May 3).

The Higher Education Committee of the House of Representatives will meet today at 3 p.m. or upon adjournment of the House if adjournment is later than 3 p.m. A delegation of East Texas residents, including President James H. Stewart, Jr., is in Austin today to attend the hearing.

Rep. Bill Clark said the earliest the bill could be voted on by the full house is May 17 if the Higher Education Committee clears it today.

Senate Bill 906 received approval of the Senate by a 26-5 vote Monday morning. This came just five days following approval of the bill by the Senate Education Committee by a 7-1 vote on April 25.

If H. B. 1706 passes the Higher Education Committee hearing, the final two steps before the proposed legislation becomes law include approval by the House and signing by Gov. William P. Clements Jr.

Merit Awards Presented To Four

Four senior accounting students are recipients of the Business Administration Merit Awards for 1978-79 at Texas Eastern University. Recipients of the awards for the spring semester are Gary Camp of Lindale and Patricia McCaa of Tyler. Fall semester recipients were Carolyn Rhodes of Kilgore and Louisa Adelung.

Each individual was presented a \$200 cash award. Money for the awards is provided by a Tyler donor who wanted to honor TEU business administration majors by recognizing their achievements while attending the university.

Committee Appointed To Plan Open House

A seven-member committee has been appointed by President James H. Stewart, Jr. to plan an open house for the Phase II facilities presently under construction on the Texas Eastern University campus.

The committee is to play an open house for the general public to have the opportunity of touring and viewing the new facilities. As a part of this special event, the Walter Carl Roddy Laboratory and William Zuckerman Laboratory will be dedicated.

Members of the committee include L. J. Grubbs, George Joyce, Gerald L. Morris, L. Lynn Sherrod, Frank H. Smyrl, Tom G. Turns and Archie Whitfield. Morris is to serve as chairman of the committee.

George Pirtle Scholarship Applications Being Accepted

The Student Financial Aid Office is accepting applications from qualified graduate students for the George W. Pirtle Graduate Scholarship. Application forms are available in the Student Financial Aid Office.

To be eligible for the scholarship, the person must be a full-time graduate student who holds a baccalaureate degree from Texas Eastern.

The amount of the scholarship award is a minimum of 1,250. One-half of the scholarship is disbursed each semester.
