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## 1980-81 Academic Year Opens With Meetings

The 1980-81 academic year opens Monday for The University of Texas at Tyler with a series of meetings scheduled. Employees will gather at 8:30 a.m. in the University Center for coffee and doughnuts.

A general opening session will be held at 9 a.m. in the University Center. President James H. Stewart, Jr. will address all university employees at that meeting. The two vice presidents will also present remarks at the meeting. The opening assembly invocation will be by Dr. Phil Hook.

A faculty meeting will be conducted at 10 a.m. in UC 134 by Donald W. Whisenhunt.

School meetings will be conducted for each of the four academic schools at appointed times and places announced by the deans.

Registration for the fall semester will be from 1-7 p.m. on August 26 with classes to begin August 27.

### Early Registration Is Productive

Early registration on August 18-19 at The University of Texas at Tyler resulted in 629 students enrolling for 6,170 semester credit hours.

Included are 254 new students who enrolled for 2,900 semester credit hours and 375 returning students who enrolled for 3,270 semester credit hours.

The new students enrolled for an average of 11.42 hours while returning students will carry an average of 8.72 per student.
