## UT Tyler Items Submitted For Board Consideration

The 1980-81 budget, a resolution relating to funding for student housing and a proposed constitution for the Student Association are items submitted by The University of Texas at Tyler for consideration as agenda items for a July 10-11 meeting of the UT System Board of Regents. The board will meet in Port Aransas.

The proposed item on housing is a request for the adoption of a resolution authorizing the filing and processing of a college housing loan application with the Department of Housing and Urban Development in federal fiscal 1980 for student housing at UT Tyler.

A student government, to be known as the Student Association, is established in the constitution which has been submitted for consideration.

Docket items submitted for board consideration include gifts to UT Tyler, contracts and grants for research, development and educational services, recommended amendments to the 1979-80 operating budget and a 1980 summer session budget.

Results from the board meeting will be reported in the next issue of Intercom which is scheduled for publication on July 24.

## Independence Day To Be Observed Friday

Friday, July 4, is an official holiday for The University of Texas at Tyler. All offices will be closed and classes will not meet.

All Thursday classes are to meet as scheduled and classes will resume on the regular schedule on Monday, July 7.

## Coordinating Board To View Plan

The reorganization plan for The University of Texas at Tyler will be presented to the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System for final review and approval at a meeting of the board on July 17-18 in Austin. Implementation of the reorganization is scheduled at the beginning of the fall semester 1980.

Work started on reorganization as early as September 1979 and was finalized in December with an announcement to employees of the university. The plan was approved by the University of Texas System Board of Regents in April.

## State Senator Addresses Forum

Senator Ed Howard of Texarkana was the featured speaker on sunset legislation and its effect on the practice of nursing in Texas at an open forum held at The University of Texas at Tyler on June 24. Senator Howard was introduced by President James H. Stewart, Jr. The meeting was presented by the Department of Nursing with Mrs. Marion Rowe coordinating the arrangements.

Howard, a member of the Sunset Commission of the Texas Legislature, spoke to a group of 95, including 16 UT Tyler students and residents of Austin, Bullard, Carthage, DeKalb, Gilmer, Gladewater, Grand Saline, Gun Barrell City, Hawkins, Henderson, Jacksonville, Jefferson, Linden, Longview, Mount Pleasant, Naples, Omaha, Reklaw, Rusk, Sulphur Springs, Tyler and White Oak.

## Second Summer Session Registration Set

Registration for the second summer session at The University of Texas at Tyler is scheduled from 1-7 p.m. on Thursday, July 10. Classes begin July 11.

The second session provides students a selection of 82 classes, including 35 at the graduate level. Eleven of the classes will meet at night.

The second session ends on August 15. Summer commencement will be held at 7:30 p.m. on August 8 in the University Center with all students completing degree requirements this summer eligible to participate.

## Energy Institute Scheduled July 10- 25

"Energy, Economics and Environment," an energy institute for teachers, will be conducted July 10-25 at The University of Texas at Tyler. The institute, sponsored by Texas Power and Light Company, will bring some of the most respected voices in the fields of energy, economics and environment to the campus.

The institute is for science and social studies teachers in grades six through nine. It will deal with current energy concepts including the production of energy, the effect of energy production on the environment and economics as the basis for decision making.

Julianne Hubble will direct the institute. Participants will be eligible for six hours of graduate credit in education.

Among topics to be presented are: environmental consequences of energy production; nuclear fuel cycle-waste management; reactor safety; energy problems today and tomorrow; land reclamation in Texas; gasification of coal; energy economic environment; energy and ecology: bio-ethical priorities; the Commanche Peak project; biological effects of radiation; waste disposal and safety; alternative energy resources for Texas; gasoline from coal and other syn-fuels; the energy problem: is solar the answer; oil and gas: economics of production and processing; human aspects of nuclear energy; economic perspectives of energy and the environment; and energy conservation in the home.

Field trips are planned to fossil-fueled plants and the construction site of a nuclear-fueled power plant.

## 61 Attend Nursing Program

Nursing Responses in Emergency Situations, a continuing education program presented by The University of Texas at Austin School of Nursing in cooperation with the UT Tyler Department of Nursing, was held on the UT Tyler campus on June 23-24. Sixty-one participants registered for the seminar.

The 61 included 23 residents of Tyler and residents of Athens, Mesquite, Marshall, Dallas, Waco, Aubrey, Greenville, Mineral Wells, Malakoff, Jacksonville, Grand Saline, Bonham, Hurst, Diboll, Vernon, Rusk, Huntington, Palestine, Gainesville, Lufkin and Jefferson.
