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four UT Tyler items on board agenda

The University of Texas at Tyler will have four items—including the acceptance of two gifts—on the agenda of The University of Texas System Board of Regents when it meets Thursday and Friday in San Antonio.

The board will consider the acceptance of a gift to establish the George W. Pirtle Endowed Scholarship for Distinguished Students and a gift and pledge to establish the J.S. Hudnall Scholarships for Exemplary Leadership and Citizenship, the J.S. Hudnall Professorship in Energy and Technology and the J.S. Hudnall Professorship for American Affairs.

Other items relating to UT Tyler include the request for authorization to establish a Master of Arts degree in history and the approval of a lease with the UT Tyler Educational Foundation, Inc. for the president's residence.

Docket items submitted by UT Tyler for board consideration include amendments to the 1981-82 operating budget, business contracts for services and contracts with state and local governmental agencies.

The regents will meet at The University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio. Action on agenda and docket items will be taken Friday.
