speaker series set; F. Lee Bailey first

The University of Texas at Tyler and the Smith County Medical Society Auxiliary will cosponsor a Distinguished Lecture Series beginning Nov. 4 with defense attorney F. Lee Bailey as the first speaker.

Other scheduled lecturers in the series include William F. Buckley, Jr., author, television host and political conservative, and Arthur B. Laffer, a member of President Reagan's Economic Policy Advisory Board.

All three programs will be held in the University Center and will begin at 8 p.m.

Bailey is the author of three best-selling non-fiction books, The Defense Never Rests, For The Defense, and Cleared for the Approach. He is also author of Secrets, a best-selling novel.

The second guest lecturer in the Distinguished Lecture Series, William F. Buckley Jr., will appear on the UT Tyler campus January 20, 1983.

Arthur B. Laffer will appear on the UT Tyler campus March 10, 1983. He is professor of business economics at the University of Southern California. From 1972 through 1977, he was a consultant to the Secretaries of Treasury and Defense.

The Distinguished Lecture Series will have 300 seats in the center circle of the University Center reserved for patron ticket holders. Patrons will have the opportunity to personally meet the speakers at a private reception, will receive reserved parking on the campus and will be offered renewal privileges for the following lecture season.

Patron tickets for the Distinguished Lecture Series are available with a contribution of \$150 which is tax deductible.

board accepts bequest

The bequest from the estate of Louise Lindsey Merrick and the establishment of the Sam A. Lindsey Chair and the Sam A. Lindsey Endowment Fund for The University of Texas at Tyler was approved Oct. 8 by the UT System Board of Regents.

The Lindsey Chair is to be funded at a level of \$500,000 and a recommendation for designation of an academic area will be made at a later date.

In other board action, docket items receiving approval include the use of textbooks written by faculty, a report on small classes taught in the summer terms, a holiday schedule for classified and non-teaching employees, a contract with a non-governmental agency, and amendments to the 1981-82 operating budget.

housing study has OK

A feasibility study on student housing which proposes a concept of a two-phase construction program to accommodate a maximum of 608 students for The University of Texas at Tyler has received approval of the UT System Board of Regents.

Estimated total construction cost is \$13,545,632. Board approval of the concept allows UT Tyler to pursue methods and/or sources of financing for the project. When appropriate financing becomes available, a request for project authorization will be submitted to the board.

The first phase of the construction would accommodate 380 students within a five-building apartment complex and would include a central commons building. Construction cost of the first phase is estimated at \$8,466,020 for 119,240 square feet.

Second phase of construction would be for 228 students, adding 69,864 square feet in three buildings containing 40 units each at an estimated cost of \$5,079,612.

Each phase would include combinations of efficiency, onebedroom, and two bedroom apartments to be located on a 17.2 acre tract in the northwest portion of the campus.

United Way Campaign underway

The 1982 United Way Campaign is underway on The University of Texas at Tyler campus. The university is working as a part of the Greater Tyler United Way Campaign which has a goal of \$850,000 to provide support for 22 community programs.

Serving as the UT Tyler campaign committee are Mrs. Doris Bowman, coordinator of student publications and public information, Mrs. Lynn Reynolds, president of the 8-5 Forum and secretary in the Department of Special Services, and Dr. Robert Geffner, assistant professor of psychology.

UT Tyler employees gave \$2,584.10 in the 1981 campaign, a record level of support for the university.
