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## **library ceremony set Saturday, Oct. 9**

The University of Texas at Tyler will name its library in memory of Robert R. Muntz in a ceremony Saturday, Oct. 9, at 5 p.m.

Dr. George F. Hamm, president of the university, said the naming of the library "will provide a lifetime memorial to Mr. Muntz, a man who was keenly interested in books, libraries and the opportunity to learn."

Mr. Muntz had many interests because of his desire to further his own education. When he became interested in a subject, he would purchase and read every book available. Libraries and bookstores were among the first places he visited upon arriving in any city. His interest in libraries centered around the knowledge which could be gained there and he saw books for their value to learning.

Mr. Muntz died on June 29, 1978 at the age of 55. After graduating from high school, he entered Toledo University to secure a degree in chemical engineering. While serving in the United States Army, he attended the University of Mississippi to secure course work in mechanical engineering. Upon discharge from the service, he enrolled in the University of Texas at Austin.

During the Oct. 9 program on the UT Tyler campus, a plaque will be placed in the library to honor the Muntz family. The public is invited to attend the ceremony.
