Bilingual education faculty appointed

Two professors have been selected for the bilingual education teacher training program at UT Tyler. Dr. Ernest Perez is directing the Title VII Bilingual Education Project and Dr. Delma Banuelos is an assistant professor for the program.

"The purpose of the project is to increase the pool of qualified bilingual educators," Dr. Mac Moseley said.

A \$90,347 grant was awarded to the university in December by the U.S. Office of Education for the bilingual training program.

Perez served as state director of the Division of Bilingual Education for the Texas Education Agency for the past six years. His major responsibility was to implement state mandated programs. He earned his Ph.D. and Master of Education degrees from The University of Texas at Austin and a Master of Arts degree from the University of Nebraska.

Banuelos received an Ed.D. degree from Wayne State University in Detroit, Mich. Her Master of Education and Bachelor of Arts degrees are from Texas Woman's University. Before joining the UT Tyler faculty this spring, she was co-director of the Immersion Learning Project at Wayne State University and an associate professor in the Department of Special Education.

William F. Buckley Jr., noted conservative writer and political analyst, attracted an audience of more than 700 to the second of the 1982-83 Distinguished Speaker Series Thursday night.

Special guests at the speech were Mr. and Mrs. James Michener and Mr. Mrs. Malcom Milburn. Mrs. Milburn is a member of the UT System Board of Regents and a cousin of Buckley.

Prior to the speech, Buckley and Michener were honored at a reception for patron ticket holders at Willow Brook Country Club and Buckley held a press conference which was attended by representatives of the media from throughout East Texas.

The final presentation of the current Distinguished Lecture Series will feature Arthur B. Laffer on March 10.

5. Entries will be accepted beginning Tuesday, Feb. 1, 1983 through Friday, March 25, 1983 in the Student Services Office.

6. Each student is limited to three entries.

After all entries have been received, a panel of judges will select the winning design. The winner will be announced after spring break, Tuesday, April 5.
