Distinguished Lecture series begins Nov. 10

The University of Texas at Tyler and the Smith County Medical Society Auxiliary will again sponsor a Distinguished Lecture Series at the university with two-time Pulitzer Prize recipient Arthur Schlesinger Jr. opening the series on Nov. 10.

Other lecturers in the 1983-84 series include ABC news correspondent Bettina Gregory on Feb. 23, 1984, and the former director of the Central Intelligence Agency, Admiral Stansfield Turner, on April 5, 1984.

All three lectures will be held in the University Center, beginning at 8 p.m.

The Distinguished Lecture Series will have 200 seats for patron ticket holders in the center circle of the University Center. Patron tickets for the three lectures are available at \$150 per person.

Ticket distribution plans for UT Tyler students and employees will be announced later.

UT Regents meet in Galveston
