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Pirtle gift establishes professorship

A gift of \$110,000 to The University of Texas at Tyler by George W. Pirtle and his grandson Robert S. Pirtle for the establishment of an endowed distinguished professorship in free enterprise was announced May 10 by UT Tyler president Dr. George F. Hamm.

"The Pirtle family has given great strength to this university since its conception. The George W. and Robert S. Pirtle Distinguished Professorship will provide opportunities to bring top scholars from throughout the world to our campus. All of East Texas as well as our students will have greater opportunities as a result of their generosity," Dr. Hamm said.

In recognition of the contribution, Pirtle was named Patriot of the Year at UT Tyler's pre-commencement dinner at Hollytree Country Club. He is the third recipient of the honor. Previous recipients include Mrs. Robert Muntz in 1982 and James S. Hudnall in 1983.

Morris receives Amoco Award

Dr. Gerald Morris, professor of mathematics, is the 1984 recipient of the Amoco Teaching Excellence Award for The University of Texas at Tyler.

President George F. Hamm recently presented Morris a \$1,500 gift from the Amoco Foundation. The Foundation provides each of the seven general academic components of the UT System with that amount to be used for outstanding teaching awards. The purpose of the award is to recognize excellence in teaching performance at the undergraduate level by senior staff and to provide an incentive to achieve that goal.

Morris has been a member of the UT Tyler faculty since January 1973. Before coming to Tyler, he was an associate professor of mathematics at The University of Texas at Arlington. He was a teaching assistant at both The University of Texas at Austin and Texas Tech University.

Morris is the sixth recipient of the Amoco award at UT Tyler. The previous selections were Dr. W. Clayton Allen, chairman of the Department of Technology; Dr. Olga Howard Fischer, assistant professor of education; Dr. Tommy D. Gilbreath, associate professor of technology; Dr. C. Ray Gullett, professor of business administration; and Dr. J. Paxton Hart, professor of English.

The selection process was conducted by the Faculty Awards Committee of the Faculty Senate and involved input from faculty and students.

Open Market Requisitions

The deadline for submitting Open Market Requisition for fiscal year '84 to the Purchasing Office is June 15. Any requistions for open market orders received after June 15 will be charged to FY-85 funds. Effective immediately and until the end of the current fiscal year, any requisition which is intended to be charged to FY-84 funds should be clearly marked in red on the face of the requisition.

Contract and Spot Purchase Requisitions

The deadline for submitting fiscal year '84 contract and spot purchase requisitions to the Purchasing Office is August 10. Any requisitions received after August 10 will be charged to FY-85 funds.

Rental Orders

Rental orders are not automatically renewed at the end of each fiscal year. Requisitions for renewal of rental orders should be submitted to the Purchasing Office by June 15 or as soon thereafter as possible so they can be processed through the State Purchasing and General Services Commission prior to the beginning of the next fiscal period.

Maintenance Agreements

Maintenance agreements must also be renewed on an annual basis. Submit each maintenace agreement request separately on a departmental purchase requisition to the Purchasing Office by June 15.

Any order placed from FY-84 for consumable items should be submitted early enough for the goods to be received by August 31. Requisitions submitted after the above cut-off dates will be assigned FY-85 purchase order numbers and will be paid from FY-85 funds.
