## Registration set for spring semester Jan. 14

Registration for the spring semester at UT Tyler is scheduled from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 14 in the University Center. Classes begin Jan. 15.

Late registration will be held from 8 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Jan. 15-16, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Jan. 17, 8 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Jan. 20-21 and 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Jan. 22.

"Students who early registered and need to make schedule changes will be permitted to add and drop courses on the day of registration," Martha Wheat, director of admissions, said.

Late registration begins in the academic departments and is to be completed in the Administration Building, she added. Faculty will be stationed on the second floor of the Administration Building between 5 - 6:30 p.m. Jan. 15-16 and 20-21.

More than 1,550 students participated in early registration Dec. 2-5, Wheat said.

### Pay checks released Dec. 31

Pay checks and/or warrants will be released to employees Dec. 31 from 10 a.m. - noon. Please have available some form of picture identification (e.g., driver's license). If you authorize your wife, friend, secretary, etc. to pick up your check, the following **must be** presented to the cashier's office:

1. A notarized letter of authorization from the employee giving approval to release check or warrant to the person receiving it.

2. Picture identification of person receiving check or warrant.

Note: The cashier's office will not mail or deposit any payroll checks Dec. 31. Checks and warrants not picked up will be released at 10 a.m. as normal Jan. 2.

Following commencement, the Alumni Association will host a reception on the second floor of the University Center.
