Aerobics seminar set January 19

The UT Tyler Office of Continuing Education and the Tyler Metropolitan YMCA will cosponsor a one-day seminar by Dr. Kenneth Cooper and his wife, Millie, from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 19 in the University Center. The Coopers will discuss "Aerobics: The Science of Preventive Medicine."

The practical, results-oriented seminar is designed to teach participants to use physical exercise in their daily routines and to establish a personal program of physical fitness. Cooper started the aerobic exercise movement in 1968 and founded the Aerobics Center in Dallas in 1970. He is the author of five books on aerobics.

Registration fee for the seminar is \$30 until Jan. 16 and \$40 thereafter. Registration includes all lectures, lunch and address by Millie Cooper, and a T-shirt. Tickets are available at the Tyler YMCA Family Center, BancTexas, Republic Bank, First City National Bank, East Texas Savings & Loan's downtown office, and the UT Tyler Office of Continuing Education.

Postage rates to increase Feb. 17

Postage rates for first-class and other mail will increase Feb. 17, the first general increase in postal rates in more than three years.

The cost of sending a letter by first-class mail will rise two cents to 22 cents while the cost for each additional ounce remains unchanged at 17 cents. Post cards go up a penny to 14 cents.

All new rates will take effect at 12:01 a.m., Feb. 17. The rates reflect a 10 percent increase.

Highlights of the rate package, in addition to the 22-cents first class postage rate include:

An 18-cent rate for regular presorted first-class mail and 17 cents for carrier route presorted first-class mail;

A rate increase of 13.8 percent for third-class regular bulk mail.

McKnight appointed to board

The appointment of Peyton McKnight to the Development Board of The University of Texas at Tyler was approved Dec. 14 by The University of Texas System Board of Regents at their meeting in El Paso.

While serving in the state senate, McKnight introduced the bill which moved UT Tyler into the UT System as its 14th component. Prior to his election to the Senate, McKnight served as a member of the Texas A&M University Board of Regents.

In other action relating to UT Tyler, the regents approved a grant to a faculty member, business contracts for services, standard affiliation agreements and amendments to the 1984-85 operating budget. An agenda item receiving approval was a recommendation for oil and gas lease on property located in Moore County and a part of the Sam A. Lindsey Endowment Fund.

The \$15,570 grant, made by Texas A&M to Dr. Davor Jedlicka, is to continue his studies on "The Impact of Texas Coastal Industrial Development and Population Growth Upon the Allocation of Marine Resources."

Funds which Texas A&M furnish under the grant are supplied by the National Oceanic and Astmospheric Administration.

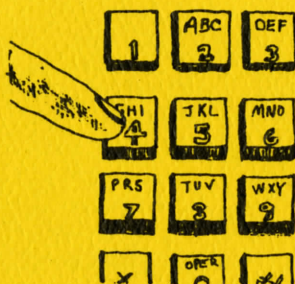

TELEPHONE TIPS

The University of Texas at Tyler has TEX-AN lines available for employees to place and receive long distant calls within the state of Texas. To use TEX-An for an outgoing call, depress the "8" button on the telephone set. This gets a TEX-AN line. Next, dial the proper numbers.



Use of the TEX-AN network allows the employee to place all official buisness long distance calls to any location in Texas without paying a long distance charge on a per call basis.

Employees should not use the 1+ system while calling within the state. Every called placed on the 1+ basis is charged to the UT Tyler telephone bill at the same rate as any business. TEX-AN is not a free telephone service but its rates are considerably cheaper that AT&T.
