Alcohol and Drug Abuse Workshop slated July 18

A workshop on alcohol and drug abuse will be presented from noon-5 p.m. Thursday, July 18 in ADM 127. University Park Hospital and The University of Texas at Tyler Department of Psychology are cosponsoring the program which is open to the public at no charge.

"Intoxification of American Labor: The Impact of Alcohol and Drug Abuse on American Business" is the workshop topic. Keynote speaker will be Dr. Richard Weddige, associate professor and associate chairman, School of Medicine and Department of Psychiatry, Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center.

Additional speakers are George Pate, substance abuse program director, University Park Hospital, and Rick Boardman, executive director, Smith County Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse.

Department of Health sets workshop Friday

New regulations regarding hazardous wastes is the topic of the Texas Department of Health workshop at 9:30 a.m. Friday, July 12 in ADM 127. Open to the public at no charge, the workshop is one of several being held statewide.

The workshop will address new federal rules effective Aug. 15 and recent amendments to state law which place regulation of all hazardous wastes under the Texas Water Commission as of Sept. 1.

Good Neighbor Scholarships awarded

The Good Neighbor Scholarship at The University of Texas at Tyler has been awarded to two brothers from Venezuela.

Elias Badih Elarba and Jorge Elarba, natives of Maturin Monagas, Venezuela, were nominated by the university to each receive the scholarship which is administered by the State Board of Education. Elias is majoring in computer science and Jorge is a general business major.

Purpose of the Good Neighbor Scholarship is to promote goodwill between countries and to recognize students who have demonstrated academic accomplishments. To be nominated, a student must be a native-born citizen of another nation in the American hemisphere. The commissioner of education reviews the nominations and recommends a statewide list of nominees and alternates to the State Board of Education. The board officially designates the scholarship recipients.
