Commencement set for Aug. 15

The University of Texas at Tyler will recognize 234 degree candidates — including 152 at the bachelor's level and 82 at the master's level — during summer commencement Friday, Aug. 15. Ceremonies begin at 7:30 p.m. in Caldwell Auditorium.

President George F. Hamm will give the commencement address and confer degrees. Presentation of degree candidates will be by Dr. Thomas L. Fernandez, vice president for academic affairs, and representatives of the four schools: Dr. Robert L. Cox, dean, Education and Psychology; Dr. F. Lannom Smith, dean, Liberal Arts; and Dr. L. Lynn Sherrod, dean, Sciences and Mathematics. Macebearer will be Dr. Frank H. Smyrl, senior charter faculty member.

The processional will be played by Vicki Jacks Conway, pianist and instructor of music. Roger Bryant, tenor, will perform Schubert's "Die Allmacht" accompanied by pianist Ruth Walker. Dr. Kenneth Muckelroy, Department of Music chairman, will lead the audience in "America the Beautiful" and the alma mater.

The Rev. E. Ross Richardson, minister, University Christian Church, will provide the invocation and benediction, and Joe Brodnax, alumni association president, will give the alumni presentation.
