Sills to speak in lecture series

Opera star Beverly Sills will be the next speaker in UT Tyler's Distinguished Lecture Series Tuesday, Dec. 2. Sills will speak at 8 p.m. in the University Center.

Now general director of the New York City Opera, Sills made her first national tour at the age of 16 and launched a singing career that took her to virtually every major city in the United States and Europe. She has had starring roles in more than 100 operas.

As a lecturer, she has brought warmth, intelligence and humor to the lectern, captivating audiences and earning her recognition as one of the world's favorite speakers.

Summer school plans announced

A full schedule for two summer school sessions in 1987 at UT Tyler has been announced by President George F. Hamm. The two sessions will offer a total of approximately 350 courses at the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Early registration for summer school will be held April 20-23, 1987, followed by regular registration for the first summer term on June 1. Classes for Summer I will begin June 2 and continue through July 7. Regular registration for the second summer term will be July 9, with classes starting July 10 and continuing through Aug. 14.

UT Tyler's summer program for 1987 also will feature continuation of the Windsor-Richardson Summer Scholars Program which brings distinguished visiting professors and world-renowned guest lecturers to the campus during both summer sessions.
