Printmaker featured as visiting artist Jan. 28

David Conn, associate professor of art and head of printmaking at Texas Christian University, will discuss his work at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 28 in BUS 158. He is the second speaker in the Department of Art's Visiting Artist Lecture Series for 1986-87.

Recipient of a National Endowment for the Arts Visual Artists Fellowship, as well as a Ford Foundation Fellowship, Conn has had works exhibited in Europe, the Far East, and Central and South America. His exhibits in the United States include those at the Baltimore Museum of Art, Laguna Beach Museum of Art and the Dallas Museum of Art.

Conn has had one-man exhibitions at the University of Arizona, TCU, Tarrant County Community College and the Amarillo Arts Center. His juried exhibitions include "Texas Visions," Museum of Art of the American Southwest, Houston; and the International Art Competition, Los Angeles, for which he was awarded a gold medal for first place. He holds an M.F.A. from the University of Oklahoma and a B.F.A. from the Maryland Institute College of Art.
