International law expert to speak in guest lecturer series

Rafael Nieto Navia, a recognized authority on international law, will be the fourth speaker in the series of special guest lecturers presented by the 1987 UT Tyler Windsor- Richardson Summer Scholars Program.

Navia will speak at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, July 28 in the University Center. The program is open to the public at no charge.

Vice-president of the Inter-American Court on Human Rights, Navia is professor of international public law at the Universidad Javeriana (Xaverian University) in Bogota, Colombia where he was named distinguished professor in the faculty of law.

He is a member of the Advising Commission on Foreign Relations of Colombia and in 1984 was appointed to the Commission on Constitutional and Legal Affairs by Colombia government decree. He earned a doctorate of juridical and economic sciences from Universidad Javeriana in 1962 and has written a column for the newspaper "El Siglo" since 1957.

Established in 1986 through a major gift from Mrs. W.C. Windsor of Tyler, the Windsor-Richardson Summer Scholars Program is named in honor of Mrs. Windsor and her late husband, Wilbur Cunningham Windsor, and their daughter and son-in-law, the late Gertrude Anne and Will Mann Richardson.
