Degree title change, math grant approved

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board has approved a change in title for a master's degree program and announced the awarding of an Eisenhower Mathematics and Science Act Grant of \$31,644 to conduct a computer-assisted mathematics instruction project at UT Tyler.

The Master of Public Administration degree replaces the M. S. degree in public planning and administration.

The Eisenhower Mathematics and Science Act Award is one of 30 given by the Coordinating Board. Dr. Stephen B. Rainwater, assistant professor of computer science, is author of the grant proposal to conduct a three-week summer institute at the university emphasizing computer-assisted mathematics instruction for T.I.S.D. secondary school teachers.

The project, "Using Technology in Secondary Mathematics," is intended to improve and expand effective methods of teaching secondary mathematics through the use of computers and calculators in the classroom.

'Beatles' to return in concert Dec. 2

A musical and visual re-creation of the Beatles will return to Tyler Saturday, Dec. 2 as the group 1964 performs in concert at 7 p.m. in the University Center. Tickets are available from the Student Association for \$8 general admission and \$3 to students.

1964 made new fans in Tyler when it first performed at the university in 1987. Since then the group has been featured on "Entertainment Tonight," "PM Magazine," the USA Network and the Nashville Network. Nominated for 1989 Campus Entertainer of the Year and College Contemporary Music Artist of the Year awards, the group has performed its unique Beatles act in major cities throughout the United States and in Canada.

1964 consists of Mark Benson as John Lennon, Greg George as Ringo, Gary Grimes as Paul McCartney and Bob Miller as George Harrison. Exhaustive research into costumes, haircuts, speaking and singing voices, stage movements, facial expressions, equipment and the music itself produces an exciting interpretation of Beatles sound and style.
