Dr. Roger Conaway, lecturer of business administration, will be submitting a paper, "Trainers' Perceptions: The Importance of Listening Training in Work Organizations," at the National Conference of the Association for Human Resources Management and Organizational Behavior to be held in November in Boston.

Haig to speak Nov. 9

General Alexander Haig will be presented as the next speaker in the Distinguished Lecture Series on Nov. 9.

Haig's career includes duty as U.S. Secretary of State, president and chief operating officer of United Technologies Corporation, Supreme Allied Commander in Europe in command of NATO forces, and White House Chief of Staff.

His career at the White House began during the administration of President Richard Nixon, when he was military adviser to presidential aide Henry Kissinger and then deputy assistant for national security affairs. He was named White House chief of staff and during the days of the Watergate crisis was credited with keeping the executive branch of government functioning.

He served as supreme allied commander in Europe in command of NATO forces and as secretary of state under President Ronald Reagan.
