Enrollment for the fall semester has topped the 4,000 mark, setting a record for the university. Preliminary figures, prior to the 12th class day Sept. 13, indicate an approximate increase of seven percent over one year ago.

Semester credit hours in fall 1989 increased by nearly eight percent over fall 1988, according to preliminary figures.
