The Department of Music will host its first keyboard festival Friday, April 20. Constance Knox Carroll, artist-in-residence at Centenary College in Shreveport, will be guest clinician and performer for the event which is designed for junior college students and their instructors. A master class will feature students performing intermediate and advanced keyboard literature.



Carroll has received acclaim for her performances as a recitalist, orchestral soloist and chamber musician. Carroll, who received her principal training at the University of Arizona, later studied at the Eastman School of Music and received the coveted Performers' Certificate along with a Master of Music degree. She also studied as a Fulbright scholar in Vienna, Austria.

Students take first place at pre-law competition

Michele Komorowski and Richard Currie, both undergraduates at UT Tyler, won first place in the Pre-Law Society of Texas annual moot court competition recently at Southern Methodist University.

The UT Tyler team of Komorowski and Currie defeated a team from SMU in the final round, arguing an appellate case involving the First Amendment rights of high school students. Ten teams from five colleges and universities in Texas — including SMU, Howard Payne University, Midwestern State University, Texas Wesleyan and UT Tyler — participated in the competition.

Komorowski and Currie's first place team award follows their second place finish behind the UT Tyler team of John Graves and Melinda Polley at the South Texas College of Law moot court competition in February.

Sports medicine lecture planned
