Originally produced in 1970, "The House of Blue Leaves" — described by Guare as "about people whose dreams are denied" — won the New York Drama Critics Circle Award as best American play of that season and ran for 337 performances off Broadway. It was revived to critical acclaim at the Lincoln Center Theater in 1986.

Dr. Patricia A. Gajda, professor of history, presented a paper, "An East Texas View of Central Europe: Then and Now," at the fall meeting of the East Texas Historical Association Sept. 23 in Nacogdoches.

Fred Kniffen, tennis coach, has been awarded a grant for the university's tennis program through the Volvo Tennis/Varsity Awards Program. The program is administered by the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association.

Dr. Joy-Ellis McLemore, lecturer in English, presented a paper, "Did I Hear What You Didn't Say?" to the September meeting of the East Texas Historical Association in Nacogdoches.

Greg Ridenour, lecturer in geography, presented a paper at the annual meeting of the Southwest Association of American Geographers held at UT Austin. The paper, "The Statistical Study of Hydraulic Geometry: A New Direction for Compositional Data Analysis," received an honorable mention and has been accepted for publication by the journal *Mathematical Geology*. An understanding of hydraulic geometry assists civil engineers in the design of stable diversion channels, which facilitate construction near rivers and provide for flood control.

Dr. Marilyn Young, professor of business administration, has been appointed as a member of the advisory committee for the Tyler Area Business Incubator and of the Small Business Institute, Region 6, Dallas Advisory Committee. She and Dr. Leslie Toombs, assistant professor of business administration, have had a case, "Do It Right the First Time," accepted by the North American Case Research Association for presentation in Orlando, Fla. in November.

United Way pledges increase 17 percent

Contributions and pledges by UT Tyler faculty and staff to the United Way of Greater Tyler total \$6,631 to date, an increase of 17 percent over last year's campaign.

Of the 184 employees who made donations, the average gift was about \$36 per person. Contributions of \$100 or more by 23 individuals accounted for nearly 60 percent of the university's total.

Employees wishing to contribute or make a pledge may still do so, by sending their pledge card to the Public Information Office, ADM 221, said Mark Heckmann, coordinator of the university's United Way drive.

The School of Sciences and Mathematics again turned in a record amount — \$1,516, almost 23 percent of the university's total.

"Those UT Tyler faculty and staff members whose donations helped make possible this year's increase are to be congratulated for their generosity," Heckmann said.
