IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Dr. Judith C. Drew, assistant professor of nursing, has had an article, "A Descriptive Analysis of Experienced Nurses' Clinical Reasoning During a Planning Task," (co-authored with Dr. Susan J. Grobe of UT Austin School of Nursing) accepted for publication in the August 1991 issue of *Research in Nursing and Health*. Drew's article, "HMOs: History, Evolution and Survival," appeared in the March 1990 issue of *Nursing and Health Care*.

Dr. Neil B. Ford, associate professor of biology, Vincent A. Cobb and adjunct research scientist William W. Lamar had an article, "Reproductive Data on Snakes from Northeastern Texas," published in the November issue of *Texas Journal of Science*. Cobb earned his master's degree at UT Tyler and currently is pursuing a Ph.D. in biology at Idaho State University.

Dr. Tommy Gilbreath, associate professor of technology, conducted two sessions of a seminar on teambuilding for Aetna Life and Casualty on Nov. 29 and Dec. 13. He also has been asked to review a text on supervision published by Southwestern Company.

Dr. Brenda Gilliam, associate professor of special education, presented "Preparation of Minority Special Education Teachers for the 21st Century: Current Trends and Future Demands" at the 13th Annual Conference of the Council for Exceptional Children's Teacher Education Division Nov. 15 in Anchorage, Alaska.

Dr. Wendell Hewett, professor of business administration, will present a paper, "Do Consumers Believe in Brand Loyalty or Fungibility?," at the national meeting of the Decision Sciences Institute in November in San Diego, Calif. The paper will be published in the national proceedings of the meeting.

Dr. James Smallwood, assistant professor of history, has published eight articles for the two-volume *Encyclopedia of American Business History and Biography: Banking and Finance* published by Bruccoli Clark Layman. Undergraduate students who took Smallwood's HIST 4375 course in the fall have produced 20 brief articles to be published in *Encyclopedia U.S.A.: Past and Present*.

Dr. Olga Supek, visiting lecturer in anthropology, presented a paper, "Ethnicity and Democracy in Yugoslavia," during meetings of the American Anthropological Association held Nov. 30 - Dec. 2 in New Orleans. She gave a lecture and slide presentation on the same subject (focusing on the first democratic elections held in Yugoslavia, Croatia, in the spring of 1990) in the Department of Social Sciences Nov. 27.

Dr. Robert Taylor, associate professor of criminal justice, presented a paper, "The New Police Administrator: The Demands of the Information Age," at the annual meeting of the International Association of Chiefs of Police Oct. 3 - 9 in Tulsa. The paper will be published in the *IACP Police Chief Yearbook*.

Library announces document sharing program

The Robert R. Muntz Library has established an agreement with UT Austin which will provide rapid turnaround in the delivery of journal articles. Under terms of the agreement, UT Austin will supply articles requested by telefacsimile in 24 to 48 hours, or will notify UT Tyler that the article cannot be supplied. Requests should be directed through the InterLibrary Loan Department.

This rapid delivery service is priced at \$1 per page supplied, plus \$1 for telephone line charges and supplies. As always, these fees may be charged to research or departmental accounts. If UT Austin cannot supply the article, the InterLibrary Loan staff will use the telefacsimile equipment to secure the item from other sources. In this instance, the charges will be 10 cents per page, plus \$1 for telephone line charges and supplies; also, no time table for delivery of the article can be guaranteed.
