Lefevre appointed interim dean

Dr. Stephen Lefevre, professor of political science, has been appointed interim dean of the School of Liberal Arts, President George F. Hamm has announced.

Lefevre is filling a position which had been held by Dr. F. Lannom Smith who will return to the faculty as a fulltime professor of English in the Department of Humanities. Smith has been a faculty member in that department since he joined the university in 1973.

Lefevre has been a member of the UT Tyler faculty since 1975. He holds a doctoral degree in political science from the University of California, Riverside. His master's degree is from California State University, Northridge. His bachelor's degree was awarded by Loyola Marymount in Los Angeles.

Lefevre served as chairman of the Department of Social Sciences for six years. During his tenure at UT Tyler he has participated in a broad range of national and international programs. In 1989 he received a Fulbright grant for faculty development to the University of Zagreb, Yugoslavia. Other programs in which he has participated include those at the Institut Teknologi MARA, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, the Institute for Advanced Political and Strategic Studies, Jerusalem, Israel in 1985 and 1986 and at the University of Metz, France.

Dunham receives Chancellor's Council Award

Dr. Sheldon Dunham, associate professor of technology, is recipient of the 1990-91 Chancellor's Council Outstanding Teaching Award. The award recognizes excellence in teaching by faculty members at academic components of The University of Texas System.

Dunham teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in technology and is faculty advisor for the UT Tyler chapter of Sigma Tau Epsilon national professional technology organization. He serves as coordinator of the Technology Applications Laboratory at UT Tyler and as a liaison with the regional manufacturing community.

Dunham is the author of several published papers and frequently makes presentations at technology conferences and associations. He is responsible for developing a technology literacy program, "Reinforcing the At-Risk Student's Educational Environment with Technology Education," to motivate potential high school drop-outs to remain in school.

His professional memberships include National Association of Industrial Technology, Society of Manufacturing Engineers, Phi Delta Kappa, Epsilon Pi Tau and Sigma Tau Epsilon. He is a certified manufacturing technologist and has completed advanced technical training in computer aided manufacturing, just-in-time manufacturing and computer numerical control.

Prior to joining the UT Tyler faculty in 1983, Dunham was head of training and field services at Master Chemical Corporation in Ohio. He has taught at Berry College in Rome, Ga. and at Pittsburg State University in Pittsburg, Kan.
