Concert to honor musician

Music educator Arthur Ford of Tyler will be honored in a special concert by the UT Tyler Symphonic Band and Jazz Ensemble on Tuesday, Nov. 26. "A Tribute to Arthur Ford," presented at 8 p.m. in the University Center, is open to the public at no charge.

Directed by Richard Highfill, the Symphonic Band will perform selections from John Philip Sousa, Gustav Holst, Mozart and Tchaikovsky. The Jazz Ensemble, directed by George Faber and presented in its premiere performance, will perform "All of Me, "Mercy, Mercy" and "Jumpin' at the Woodside."

James Williams, director of music education for the Tyler Independent School District, will present a plaque to Ford in recognition of Ford's contributions to music.

Born near Williamstown, Missouri in 1893, Ford began studying flute, organ, violin and cornet before he was six years old. He studied aeronautical engineering at Columbia University and was involved in designing hydraulic boost controls on fighter airplanes during World War II before returning to his first love of music.

In 1950 Ford opened his own music service business in Tyler and later started the Emmett Scott High School Band in Tyler. Known nationwide for his work as band director and mentor for thousands of young students, Ford's career also has included positions as orchestra leader, booking agent for musicians, music store consultant, and managing director of the New York division of a major band instrument company.

Continuing education coordinator named

Zola Mason Walker has been named coordinator of continuing education at UT Tyler. Walker comes to the university with more than 13 years of experience in higher education, including positions with Tarrant County Junior College in Fort Worth, Jarvis Christian College in Hawkins and Penn Valley Community College in Kansas City, Missouri.

As assistant dean of community services at Tarrant County Junior College's Northwest Campus, Walker coordinated the non-credit course schedule, including developing new courses and providing supervision to professional and instructional personnel. She served on the President's Administrative Council and made presentations to on-campus groups as well as to community organizations.

At Jarvis Christian College, she served as executive assistant to the President; director of administrative services; and affirmative action officer. Her positions at Penn Valley included assistant dean of student affairs, assistant dean of administrative services, and acting dean of business affairs.

Walker, who has additional experience as a counselor and business instructor, holds an M.B.A. degree in administrative management from the University of North Texas, and M.S. and B.S. degrees from Tennessee State University.

She has been listed in Who's Who of American Women, Who's Who Among Black Americans and Personalities of the South. In 1977 she was named "Woman of the Year in Education" in Kansas City.

Walker replaces John Childs who resigned to become business officer at Jacksonville College.

Johnson were nominated for the prestigious Irene Ryan Acting Scholarship and Dr. James A. Hatfield, director of theatre, received a certificate of excellence for his set design.

Edwards, Wise and Johnson will be eligible to compete for \$1,000 scholarships at the ACTF regional festival Feb. 20 - 24 in Lubbock and have the opportunity to advance to the national festival at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C.
