International celebration planned

An International Day Celebration — featuring a musical salute to Tyler's sister cities — will be presented Tuesday, April 21 in the University Center. The event is open to the public at no charge.

The Symphonic Band, directed by Richard Highfill, will present a special performance featuring folk songs from France, Poland and Japan at 7:30 p.m., preceded by a Jazz Ensemble performance, led by George Faber, at 7 p.m.

Tyler is sister city to Metz, France and Jelenia Gora, Poland. Yachiyo, Japan will become Tyler's newest sister city during a twinning ceremony to be held May 16 as part of events preceding the May 18 Eisenhower International Golf Classic.
