Art lectures to be presented

Dr. Vincent Bruno, professor of art history at UT Arlington, will be presented Tuesday, March 10 in the Spring 1992 Art Lecture Series sponsored by UT Tyler Friends of the Arts. He will discuss "Mark Rothko and Ancient Pompeian Wall Painting" at 7:30 p.m. in LIB 401.

Bruno was awarded the Ashbel Smith Professorship in 1991 at UT Arlington where he previously served as chairman of the Department of Art. He has taught at the State University of New York and has been a senior visiting professor at the Center for Advanced Study in the Visual Arts, National Gallery, Washington, D.C.; a visiting scholar at The American Academy in Rome and at the American School of Classical Studies in Athens; and a visiting professor at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He holds a Ph.D. in art history from Columbia University.

Vicki Conway, lecturer in music, was a master class participant in the International Piano Festival 1992 presented by the University of Houston School of Music Jan. 17-19.

Dr. Donald E. The award is presented to the top 100 chartered financial analysts selected from over 8,000 around the world. Fischer was selected for outstanding achievement in the area of continuing education efforts in support of his certification as a chartered financial analyst.

Dr. Olga Howard Fischer, associate professor of education, has been invited to serve as a judge for the 1992 National Council of Teachers of English Achievement Awards in Writing. The program is designed to encourage student writers and to recognize some of the best writers in the nation. Also, Fischer and Dr. Chester Fischer, professor of education, presented a paper, "Writing Improvement Networks: Making Writing Instruction a Family Affair," at the Association of Teacher Educators 72nd Annual Meeting Feb. 17 in Orlando, Fla.

Dr. Ray Gullett, professor of business administration, is co-author of "Ward's Cove on Remand: Implications for Equal Employment Opportunity" in the September 1991 issue of *Labor Law Journal*. He also is co-author of "Managerial Indecision: Obligations and Responsibilities Under the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990," presented at the Southwestern Federation of Administrative Disciplines annual meeting March 6 in San Antonio.

Dr. David Riddle, associate professor of chemistry, presented an invited paper, "Stabilization/Solidification Techniques," at the Haz Mat '92 Southwest Conference Jan. 28-30 in Dallas. Nationally recognized music teacher Dr. Jane Magrath will be guest clinician at the third annual Keyboard Festival presented Thursday and Friday, March 12 - 13, by the Department of Music. Designed to be of special interest to area music teachers and students, all festival events are open to the public and will be held in UC 134.

Magrath will present a workshop, "Practice Techniques for the Elementary Pianist: the Secret is in How We Teach Them to Practice and Listen," 10 - 11:30 a.m. Thursday. Workshop fee is \$12 for adults, \$6 for students. Events to be presented Friday at no charge include a recital by McGrath at 11 a.m. and a master class featuring students from UT Tyler and area junior colleges 1 - 4 p.m.

Magrath has performed in recital and has conducted workshops and master classes throughout the country. She is piano coordinator for conventions of the Music Teachers' National Association, and serves on the Performance/Pedagogy Liaison Committee of the National Piano Pedagogy Conference and the Baldwin Teaching Fellowship Advisory Committee. Magrath is associate professor and chair of the piano area in the University of Oklahoma School of Music where she teaches applied piano and courses in piano pedagogy. She holds a doctor of music degree in piano performance/pedagogy from Northwestern University and is a specialist in piano teaching literature at the upper-intermediate and advanced levels.

Approximately 7,200 East Texans showed their support by attending the first regional Earth Day celebration at UT Tyler in 1990.
