Human rights leader Coretta Scott King will be presented at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 10 in the 1992-93 Distinguished Lecture Series. To accommodate the demand for tickets, the lecture is being moved to Caldwell Auditorium.

Mrs. King is founding president and chief executive officer of the Martin Luther King Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change in Atlanta, Ga.

Established as a memorial to her late husband, the center serves as a focal point for continuing the nonviolent campaign for social, political and economic justice throughout the world.

Under Mrs. King's direct leadership, the center promotes the concept of nonviolence through seminars, workshops and conferences for teachers, community leaders, administrators and others who influence young people.

Mrs. King is co-founder of the National Black Leadership Forum and a leading spokesperson for minorities on a wide range of issues. Her book, *My Life with Martin Luther King Jr.*, was a major best-seller and has been translated into 16 languages.

She is a graduate of Antioch College and the New England Conservatory of Music, and holds numerous honorary degrees. *
