Alan Ayckbourn's satirical commentary on relationships and married life, "The Norman Conquests" revolves around events taking place during one weekend at a British country house.

The trilogy returns for additional performances beginning Feb. 18. Dr. James A. Hatfield, UT Tyler director of theatre, will direct the productions.

Repertory Theatre for the spring semester also includes Harold Pinter's "Old Times," which opens March 12, and George Bernard Shaw's "Getting Married," opening April 2.

Dr. Evelyn Granville, visiting professor of mathematics, participated in the joint meetings of the American Mathematical Society (AMS) and the Mathematical Association of America (MAA) Jan. 13 - 15 in San Antonio. Granville was a speaker at a session titled "Mathematics: A Catalyst for Education Progress in the Year 2000 and Beyond — Filling the Educational Pipeline" co-sponsored by the AMS, MAA and the National Association of Mathematicians. Her topic was "Minorities in Mathematics."

Dr. Paula Lundberg-Love, associate professor of psychology, is among 100 women nationwide selected to participate in the 1993 class of Leadership America, a program of the Foundation for Women's Resources.
