United Way pledge cards due Nov. 2

Employee pledges for UT Tyler's 1993 United Way campaign are due Nov. 2. Pledge cards should be returned to the News and Information Office, ADM 221.

This year's campaign has a goal of 100 percent participation. Last year's campaign resulted in a 6 percent decrease in pledges from 1991. The average gift was \$43 per employee but less than two-thirds of faculty and staff participated. If each employee who gave \$1 last year, or who did not make a contribution, pledges just \$1 per month in 1993, UT Tyler's total contributions will increase significantly.

Employees may choose one of several convenient ways to make a donation: 1) be billed monthly or quarterly by the United Way office; 2) utilize a bank draft to deduct an amount automatically each month from their account for the United Way; 3) charge their donation to their Mastercard or Visa account; or 4) pay the full amount of their pledge or any portion with return of the pledge card.
