## UT Tyler unveils new millennium goals

As the next millennium approaches, UT Tyler has set as its vision to be "recognized nationally for high quality education in the professions and in the humanities, arts and sciences," President Rodney H. Mabry announced at the opening fall convocation.

Mabry addressed the assembly of faculty and staff and outlined the university's strategic planning effort for the next millennium. The university's new vision document also states: "Led by a supportive faculty, its graduates will be known for their leadership qualities, communication ability, technological skill,

broad cultural awareness and appreciation of traditional values."

In addition, the vision document states: "Future university graduates will need an increased awareness of the complexities of the world around them and a better understanding of their own capabilities. They will need to acquire a higher level of education and to be secure in their ability to find, process and make decisions with information that will be available in large quantities. They will need to increase their knowledge of the power of technology and their skills in using it."

#### Ten-Year Goals

- 1. Develop a nationally recognized foundation in the traditional humanities, arts and sciences—the Tyler tradition—underpinning and enhancing all educational programs.
- 2. Provide innovative educational programs for the professions that are among the nation's best.
- 3. Increase the use and understanding of information technology.
- Significantly develop leadership qualities, communication ability, cultural and global awareness and appreciation for traditional values in UT Tyler graduates.
- Establish an active learning environment in all academic programs, where hands-on, project-oriented learning is emphasized in a setting of small class sizes, individual attention, and substantive academic goals.
- 6. Increase the quantity and quality of research and creative contributions of the faculty.
- Continuously enhance the quality of life for students, faculty, and staff during their UT Tyler experience.
- Increase meaningful service to the East Texas community and expand economic development.
- 9. Increase student enrollment growth in order to establish a nationally recognized, comprehensive, four-year university of 7,000 students.

## In the spotlight

Dr. Ford and collaborator Larry Chambers of Camp Tyler presented a paper titled "A Capture-Recapture Study of the Gulf Coast Waterdog, Necturus beyeri, Conducted by Fifth-grade Students." Dr. Gutberlet also presented a paper titled "Toward a Monophyletic Classification of Pitvipers."

Dr. Mark Kroll, Pirtle Distinguished Professor of Free Enterprise, has been selected to participate in the Fulbright Scholar Program. Dr. Kroll will spend the fall 1999 semester as a visiting professor at the Hanoi School of Business at Vietnam National University in Hanoi, Vietnam.
